“Why do you seek the Living One among the dead? He is not here, but He has been raised.”
(Luke 24: 5-6)

We come together today, meant to experience an incomparable and immeasurable joy! We come as a people of faith, meant to be filled with indescribable hope and anticipation! For today, we celebrate this most wondrous expression of God’s infinite love, the triumph of God over sin, suffering and death, and His invitation to all of us to share in that triumph.

Saint Paul so often tells us to keep our eyes on what is “above”, not on what is “below”, for it is only in “seeing” the things of heaven, that we can even begin to make sense of the things on earth. And that is what the “Easter Event” offers to us, for this is the singular event in all of human history that brings clarity and meaning to all things in this life.

Just a little less than four months ago, we celebrated the glorious event of Christmas, that reality of God becoming Man; the fulfillment of the promise of God that He would send us a Savior to redeem us from our sins. Now, we recall “why” God was born, to unite Himself to all of us in the most dramatic and ultimate hardship and suffering - that of death. He dies for us so that He can then rise for us so to show us where we, one day, can also be.

And this is the unfathomable gift that God gives to us, for this reality of Jesus’ resurrection from the dead is not just something that happens to Him. It is something offered to all who are united to Him. For in our Baptism, each of us “died with Christ”, so that we might “rise with Him.”

And this reality is not just something we recall or remember, but it is something that we actually are “connected to”, here and now. For at every Mass, that saving action of Christ on His cross and His glorious resurrection is made present for us. The Church teaches us that “the sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are *one single sacrifice.*” (CCC #1366) So here, and at every Mass, we are then called to join ourselves to His sacrifice so to be joined, one day, forever in the glory of His resurrection.

On a personal note, I want to express my heartfelt thanks to so many of you who have done so much over the past weeks to make our Easter celebration so wonderful – Ginny Pryor and her group of volunteers who have decorated our Sanctuary with such beauty; Kyle Postlethwait and the Choir who enhance our experience of these Liturgies, particularly during these last three days of our Paschal Triduum. And, especially, I want to thank each of you for your witness of faith. As I have often said, “I love Lent”, and I think the major reason for this is that I see the fidelity and holiness of so many of you. I pray that the graces that we have received during these last 40 days may now bear great fruit during this Easter Season and beyond.

May our Lord, who has burst forth from the tomb and now reigns in the glory of heaven, now burst into each of our lives to be with us to lead us throughout this life to that never ending life meant for all of us, with Him, in His Eternal Kingdom of Heaven. Happy Easter!!



What is the Liturgy of the Hours?



Have you ever heard of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as The Divine Office? This ancient prayer is a structured way of praying Scripture throughout the day with special emphasis on the Psalms. The purpose is to sanctify the day by praying morning, afternoon, evening, and at nighttime so that the whole day is made holy by praising the Lord. The original "hours" had five components: Morning Prayer, Daytime Prayer, Evening Prayer, Night Prayer, and the Office of Readings. The Holy Family prayed the Psalms as did St. John Paul II, Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati, St. Augustine, St. Therese of Lisieux and more.

Word On Fire, Bishop Barron's multi media evangelization platform, has released a new and easier means of praying the Liturgy of the Hours. Rather than thick volumes with colored ribbons, the *Word On Fire Liturgy of the Hours* is a monthly subscription booklet that has Morning, Evening, and Night Prayer. The cost for each monthly book is \$7.00. The time commitment is roughly 15 minutes each for Morning and Evening Prayer and 5 to 10 minutes to complete Night Prayer.
