SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Father Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

FEED THE HUNGRY

A very heartfelt thank you to all of you who continue to regularly support our mission to feed the hungry. The March collection totaled 974 pounds of food. We will hold the **April collection at all Masses on the 6th and 7th**. The pantry requests the following: pasta, pancake mix, pancake syrup, canned mushroom soup, canned diced tomatoes, canned spinach, canned potatoes, canned spaghetti sauce, white rice, canned pineapple, small (15 oz) peanut butter and cereal. Bless you for sharing your blessings with others.

“Rejoice, Jerusalem . . . and all who love her.” (Isaiah 66:10)

We prayed these words of our Entrance Antiphon as we began Mass today on this Fourth Sunday of Lent. This Sunday is traditionally known as “Laetare Sunday”, “laetare” being the Latin word that begins this Antiphon, which means “rejoice”. And our Readings today give us several perspectives and insights from which, hopefully we can experience that joy that Christ alone can give.

Our Gospel deals with Jesus’ curing of the blind man and then the contentious dialogue that is played out between Jesus and the Pharisees. We are first called to see that blind man as symbolizing all of us since each of us is “blind” in some way because of own wounded condition of Original Sin. Our own sin brings us even deeper into that darkness that will come with our sin. We are then meant to see that “blindness” of the Pharisees, how they are so critical and so opposed to God’s law of love.

And so, we are meant to reflect upon that call to conversion that Lent presents. We need to embrace the call to prayer, fasting and almsgiving, which will lead us, in that phrase of Saint Paul in our Second Reading, to “live as children of the light”. We need to “take no part in the fruitless works of darkness”, to turn from those sins and habits of sin that can plague us.

Obviously, the more we can turn from sin, the more joy we will have in our hearts. We will more fully embrace the will of God as it is manifested in all things and we will experience a deeper calm. So, often that darkness that plagues us is in a general agitation and anger that comes from our unfulfilled selfish desires. It is our Responsorial Psalm that is meant to cure us, those first eleven words of Psalm 23 that we sang as the Response; “The Lord is my Shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.”

Let us just pause and meditate on what these words mean. Let us strive to put these words into practice in our attitude so to be released from that angst that can afflict us.

So, where is the “blindness” that plagues us? Where is the darkness in our souls where that light of Christ needs to break through?

We will celebrate our Parish Penance Service this Tuesday evening, April 1st, at 7:00 p.m. All of us need God’s mercy since all of us are sinners. Let us not be like the Pharisees in our Gospel who think they see clearly but are the ones who are really “blind”. Rather, let us come to the Lord to seek His healing and His mercy so we too then can see more clearly by that light of Christ, to live more fully as “children of light” so to then “rejoice” now and always in the healing and the peace that He alone can give.


