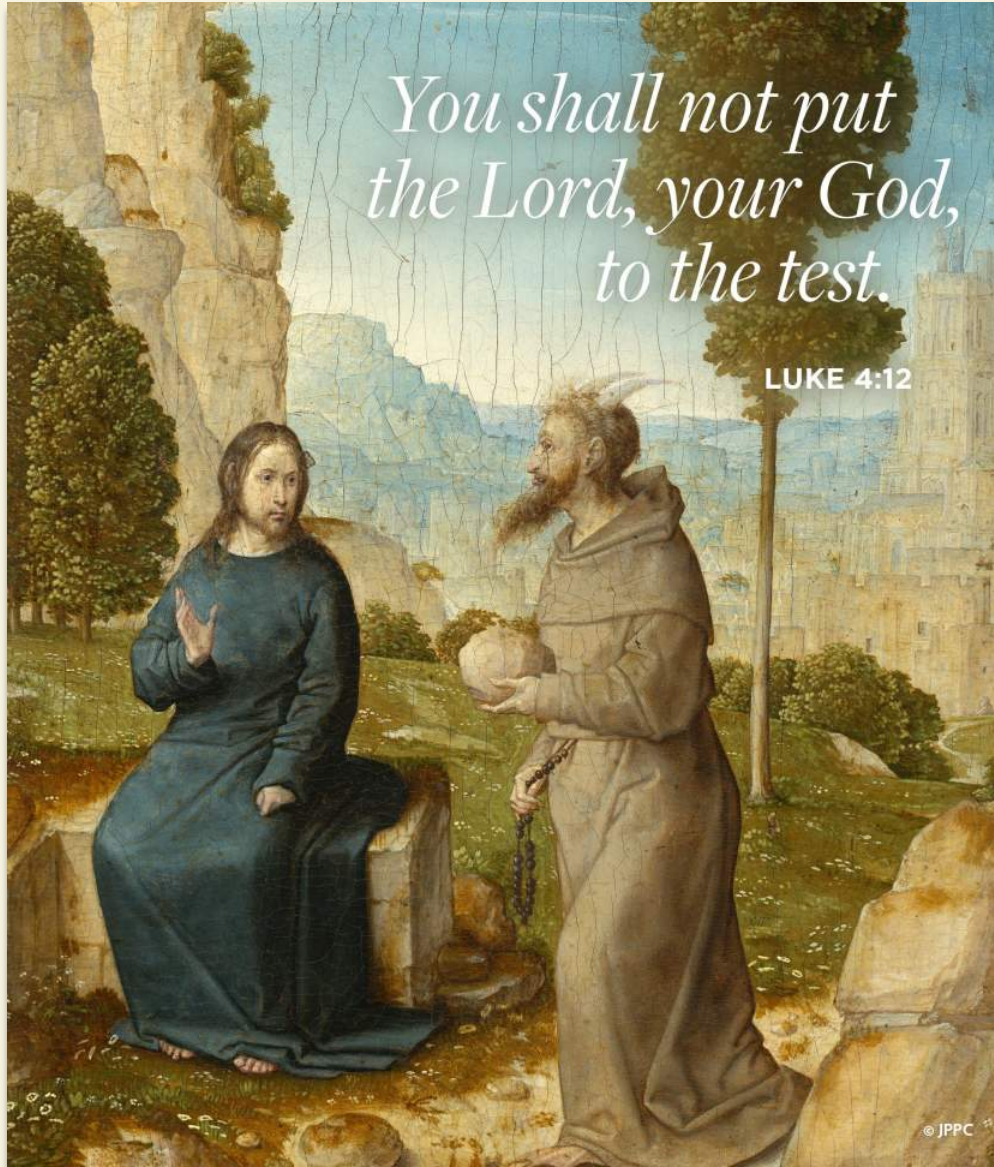

## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Father Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

## SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Father Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

## SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

**“Jesus said to him in reply, ‘It is written: You shall worship the Lord, your God, and Him alone shall you serve.’” (Luke 4:8)**

We hear these words of Our Lord at that second temptation of the devil in today’s Gospel. Jesus is “promised” the power and glory of all the kingdoms of the world, which of course, are already His. The most obvious aspect of this temptation is that it is “a lie”, as with all that Satan says and does, and in response, Our Lord proclaims this most liberating truth that we are all to live, that all of us are called to worship and serve God alone.

And so, He has brought us again to another year and another Lent. This past Wednesday, we heard, as we do each year, from Chapter 6 of the Gospel of Saint Matthew, part of that famous “Sermon on the Mount”; in which Jesus gives us a three part plan to grow in that strength that we need. It is simple, but so deep and compelling. He calls us to “pray”, “fast” and “give alms.”

First, we hear this call to PRAYER. We can be so careful not to fall into that temptation to see prayer as an “afterthought” or something we do at the end of the day after doing all that we think we need to do. We need to see prayer as “primary” as one of the first things we need to do each day. Lent also offers to us special times of prayer, including our Friday Stations of the Cross and our normally scheduled time of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays.

Then, there is FASTING. Again, we are called to deny ourselves of something of our choosing, maybe throughout this season or on some specific days. We are called to remember that this “denial” is not an end of itself, but a means, and I would propose the most effective means, to the end of a deeper love of God. We know the obligation to not eat meat on Friday, to remind us of that Friday when Christ died on the cross to offer us eternal life in Him.

Lastly, there is ALMSGIVING. I cannot begin to describe my gratitude for the generosity of so many expressed each week in our normal Sunday collection, in all of the other special collections throughout the year, and especially for that overwhelming success we have enjoyed in our 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Appeal to help our School. And of course, as we begin Lent, we have that opportunity with our Diocesan Annual Campaign, formerly known as the Annual Lenten Appeal.

This year’s theme announced by Bishop Senior is “Living our Faith; Pilgrims of Hope.” It of course, references this special Jubilee Year called by Pope Francis with its special theme and focus on that Theological Virtue of Hope, given to each of us in Baptism, defined in the Catechism as that virtue “by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ’s promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit.” (CCC #1817)

And so, having begun Lent, let us embrace that call to pray, fast and give alms, trusting, not in our own efforts but in God’s grace so that it may be a time in which all of us are richly blessed and brought closer to Christ, following that proclamation in today’s Gospel to more fully worship and praise God each day, and serve Him alone. God bless you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>, we begin our sacred journey of Lent. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are a reminder to “Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.” These 40 days call us to reflect on our lives and our relationship with God. Lent invites us to prepare our hearts and minds for the glorious celebration of Easter, reminding us of the transformative power of repentance from sin and the call to remember and serve others.

I encourage you to engage in the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Fasting in Lent helps us to literally make more space and time for God in our lives during this time. While fasting to lose weight can be beneficial for your health as well, there are other ways we can fast: perhaps we could introduce periods of time to fast from television or social media. Fasting can help us to better understand the relentless misery of those who are not giving up eating as a choice; they simply have no food. In a world that tells us that we should indulge ourselves, fasting tells us something different. In my own spiritual exercises for Lent, I have found it helpful to offer my fasting, prayers, and almsgiving for specific intentions so as to remind myself that their focus should be both on my love for Jesus, who died on the Cross for all of us, as well as for the good of others. This year I am offering my Lenten Disciplines for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life within our Diocese; for world peace, especially in the Ukraine and Gaza; for the victims and survivors of human trafficking; and for distressed migrants and refugees in our country and throughout the world. I suggest that you consider offering your Lenten Disciplines for these intentions as well, or for specific charitable intentions of your own.

There is a Greek word that is a perfect definition of the Lenten journey; that word is Metanoia. It means “turning back.” In Lent we turn away from our worldly distractions, and back toward God. We strive to become more like Jesus while helping others, particularly those most in need, to achieve the same. To assist us with this goal, I especially encourage you to go to Mass at least one extra day during Lent, to pray the Stations of the Cross, and especially to make a good confession. In the words of Pope Francis: “While God is firm in his call for conversion, he is always waiting to receive the sinner with open arms. ‘The God of mercy; he does not tire of forgiving. We are the ones who tire in asking for forgiveness, but he does not tire’” (Daily Mass Homily, March 28, 2014. See also *Evangelii Gaudium*, November 24, 2013, N.3).

We can also reflect even further on the theme of our Jubilee year – Pilgrims of Hope. As pilgrims of hope, Lent is an opportunity to focus on the virtue of hope. We can all find hope in God who is always with us. There is much sorrow and uncertainty in the world and in so many peoples’ lives, particularly the poor, the lonely, the forgotten, and the marginalized. Whether found on the streets or abandoned in a nursing home, each is still a child of God worthy of our attention. As Pope Francis reminds us: “Sisters and brothers, thanks to God’s love in Jesus Christ, we are sustained in the hope that does not disappoint (cf. *Rom* 5:5). Hope is the “sure and steadfast anchor of the soul (Catechism of the Catholic Church n.1820).” It moves the Church to pray for “everyone to be saved” (*1 Tim* 2:4) and to look forward to her being united with Christ, her bridegroom, in the glory of heaven... May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey.”<sup>1</sup>

As we journey through Lent together, may we embrace this opportunity to reflect on our sins and receive God’s merciful forgiveness while also finding ways to remember and serve those in need, particularly in our own communities. In the spirit of this holy season, I invite you to join me in prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and service. Through remembering and serving others we can bring the hope found in Christ to our neighbors.





My prayer is that we will be open to the grace of God in these days of Lent. When Easter comes, may we all have grown closer to God, so that, as devoted Christians, we will more visibly reflect the image of Jesus in our lives.
