## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Father Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

## Hempfield Food Pantry News



What a remarkable example of generosity by the people of St. Leo's we experienced with the April collection of food for the Hempfield Food Pantry. It was the largest amount ever given - 1,339 pounds. St. Leo's school donated an additional 352 pounds. What a blessing this is for local people facing food insecurity. During the month of March the pantry served a total of 1,979 people and 51 volunteers gave 661 hours of service. Thank you and may God bless you abundantly.

Requested food items for our next collection, **May 3rd & 4th**, are: canned corn, canned tuna, mac and cheese, 1 pound bags white rice, 1 pound bags lentils, cereal, pancake mix, syrup, canned beet and canned pineapple. No green beans are needed!

Happy Easter!

We continue in this glorious celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord and that “new life” He has come to offer to all of us. Today is now the eighth day of our special Octave of Easter, these days that the Church sees as “one day”, as this Season will now extend for fifty days until the glorious Feast of Pentecost on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Each year on this Sunday, we hear this Gospel taken from Chapter 20 of the Gospel of Saint John. Our Lord appears to the Apostles and He breathes on them, giving them this Gift of the Holy Spirit, connecting it specifically to the forgiveness of our sins, that infinite mercy God extends to us by the power of His cross and resurrection.

This Sunday, the Second of the Seven Sundays of Easter that we will celebrate, is now known as Divine Mercy Sunday, having been established in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II. The Image of Divine Mercy was an image that Our Lord gave to Saint Faustina, a Polish nun, in a series of visions that she received in the 1930s. and so this Image adorns our Sanctuary today. We are called to meditate upon this reality that “God is Mercy”, that He only and always wants to fill us with that mercy and peace in the forgiveness of our sins. We come today in this special Jubilee Year, to more fully experience that mercy in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation so, basking in that power of His mercy and peace, we might say wholeheartedly those words revealed to Saint Faustina, “Jesus, I trust in You!”

We will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from the conclusion of our 11:00 a.m. Mass until 1:30 p.m., when we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and then celebrate Benediction. Father Kappes and I will be hearing Confessions in the Main Church as this day offers us that extraordinary gift of the Plenary Indulgence; so that if we go to Confession, receive Holy Communion and possess no “attachment to sin”, we receive, in this Indulgence, the remission of all “temporal punishment due to sin.”

This term, “temporal punishment due to sin” refers to that residual “debt” that is incurred by our sin and, remains even after our sins are forgiven. It is why Purgatory is needed for those souls who die in God’s grace but still with that residual debt of sin. This is why the Plenary Indulgence is such a remarkable grace from God. It removes all “debt” or “temporal punishment due to sin” so that if one were to die after receiving this special grace, he or she would be immediately welcomed into eternal glory, or if we receive that grace and then “apply” it to a soul in Purgatory, that soul is immediately released to the glory of heaven.

Let us open ourselves today and always to that greatest gift of God’s mercy, and readily share it with one another, to live more fully this “new life” He has come to bring. Happy Easter!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Easter Sunday finds us standing together at the empty tomb with Mary Magdalene and the other women, with Peter and John as we celebrate what our faith is all about: that God has restored the world, and each one of us, in the Resurrection of Jesus. Christ is risen and is with us in every step we walk, every breath that we take, every moment that we are alive. God touches us with His unfathomable love, giving us hope and reason for our Easter joy.

For Lent I invited you to join with me in offering up the traditional Lenten Spiritual Disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life within our own Diocese; for world peace, especially in the Ukraine and Gaza; for the victims and survivors of human trafficking; for distressed migrants and refugees in our country and throughout the world, or for your own worthy charitable intentions. Please continue praying for these intentions, especially during this Easter Season. We should also add to our list of intentions the earthquake victims in Myanmar and Thailand, as well as those affected by the tornadoes and flooding in our own country.

The empty tomb is the sign of the authentic hope that Christ makes all things possible, that we can make of our lives what God wants them to be. That is particularly important during this Jubilee Year of Hope. Pope Francis reminds us: “The death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith and the basis of our hope.... Christ died, was buried, was raised and appeared. For our sake, Jesus experienced the drama of death. The Father’s love raised him in the power of the Spirit, and made of his humanity the first fruits of our eternal salvation. Christian hope consists precisely in this: that in facing death, which appears to be the end of everything, we have the certainty that, thanks to the grace of Christ imparted to us in Baptism, ‘life is changed, not ended,’ (Roman Missal, Preface I for the Dead) forever. Buried with Christ in Baptism, we receive in his resurrection the gift of a new life that breaks down the walls of death, making it a passage to eternity. (n.20)”<sup>1</sup>

Pope Francis writes that Mary gives us a great example of hope. “At the foot of the cross, she witnessed the passion and death of Jesus, her innocent son. Overwhelmed with grief, she nonetheless renewed her “fiat”, never abandoning her hope and trust in God. In this way, Mary cooperated for our sake in the fulfilment of all that her Son had foretold....the Mother of God comes to our aid, sustains us and encourages us to persevere in hope and trust. (n.24)”<sup>2</sup>

The victory of Jesus over death itself, even during our most challenging days, empowers us to live our lives in the hope that there will be a resurrection at the end of our own journey. Be assured of my continued prayers and please remember me in yours. May these Easter days be a time of renewed joy and hope for you and your families. Happy Easter!
