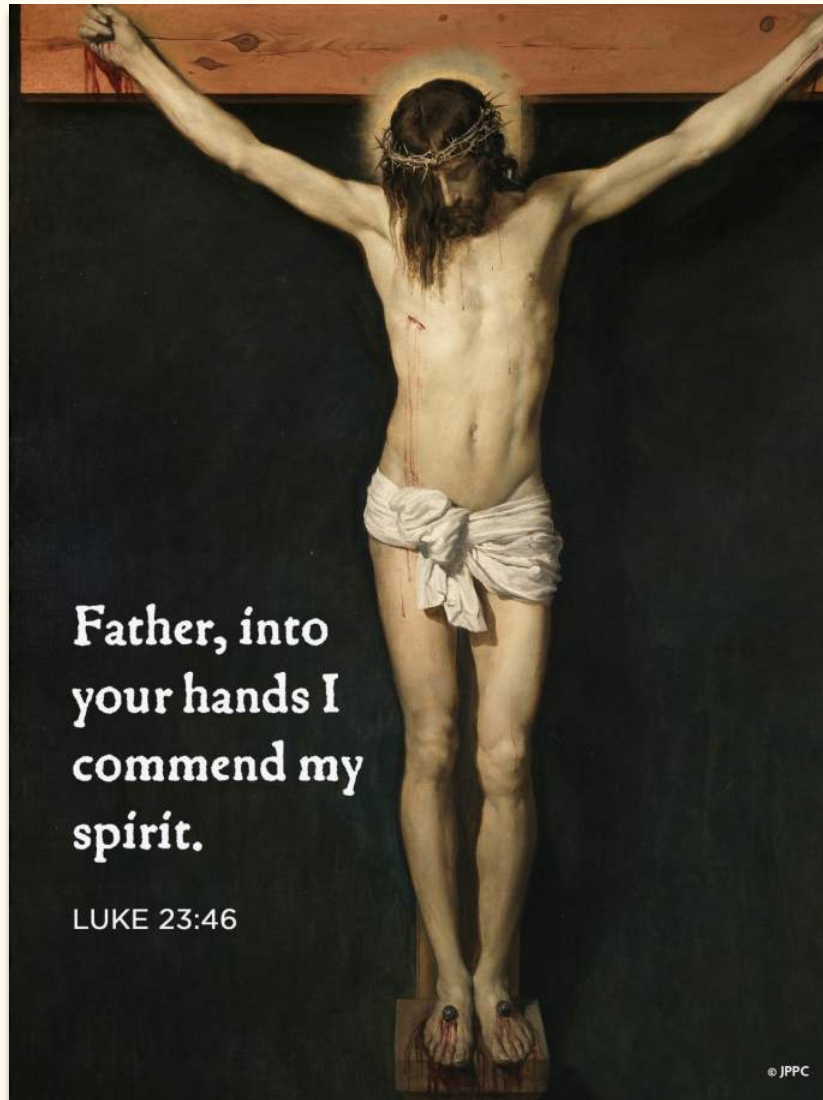

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Father Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Father Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active registered members of the parish and who are receiving the Sacraments on a regular basis.

There is no Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesday of Holy Week, **April 16th**. Daily Mass that day will be at 9:00 AM.

“Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.” (Luke 23:40)

I hope that we all have favorite passages from the Bible, certain verses or stories that we refer to from time to time; scenes and events that we meditate on that give us great hope or consolation or peace.

One of those, for me, is the scene today that we hear from in the Passion account from Saint Luke. His is the only account where we hear about the one whom we call “the good thief.” We know absolutely nothing about him, where he was from, what was his name, or even why he was being crucified. But, let’s just imagine a bit. Why was he there? What did he do? What were these last days of his life like, as he was undoubtedly filled with fear and despair, as he was sentenced to suffer this most awful execution?

When did he first hear of Jesus? How? Did he see one of His miracles or hear some of His teachings? He must have had some experience or have heard about Him since this Gospel recounts how he first utters to the other criminal, “have you no fear of God?” This is an extraordinary statement of faith and an insight into this One who hangs next to him. He then quickly follows by saying that this Man “has done nothing criminal”, professing the innocence of the Lamb of God suffering for us. And then, lastly, prompted by God’s grace, he pleads with the Lord and says, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom” to which he hears those most sublime words imaginable from the lips of Jesus, “today, you will be with me in Paradise.”

That is why, for me personally, it is a most memorable passage of Sacred Scripture. It is a scene that is dominated by one principle of our Catholic Faith; and that is the infinite mercy of God, who only and always offers to us His reconciling love in the forgiveness of our sins.

Hopefully, for us, this Lent has been a good one. Hopefully, we have been faithful in our resolutions, but perhaps, we have struggled. Perhaps, we have not followed through in our plan of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

The lesson of the “good thief” is that we can still and always turn to the Lord. While our successes in the Lenten practices will provide great graces and consolations, even our failures are opportunities for us to receive God’s greatest gift of His mercy.

I want to thank so many, who in so many ways, have shown to me your great faith over these past five and a half weeks of Lent: your generous response to our Diocesan Annual Campaign, formerly called our Lenten Appeal, the great attendance at our Forty Hours Devotions, the work of so many who made our Lenten Meals such a success, your presence at our Stations of the Cross and Daily Mass and in so many other ways of your giving to the Parish. I pray for all of us, that this Holy Week may be one of great blessings as we continue in our journey of faith, which we pray will one day lead us to that place where the “good thief” once was, next to our Lord, hearing those words for which all of us long, “today, you will be with me in Paradise.”

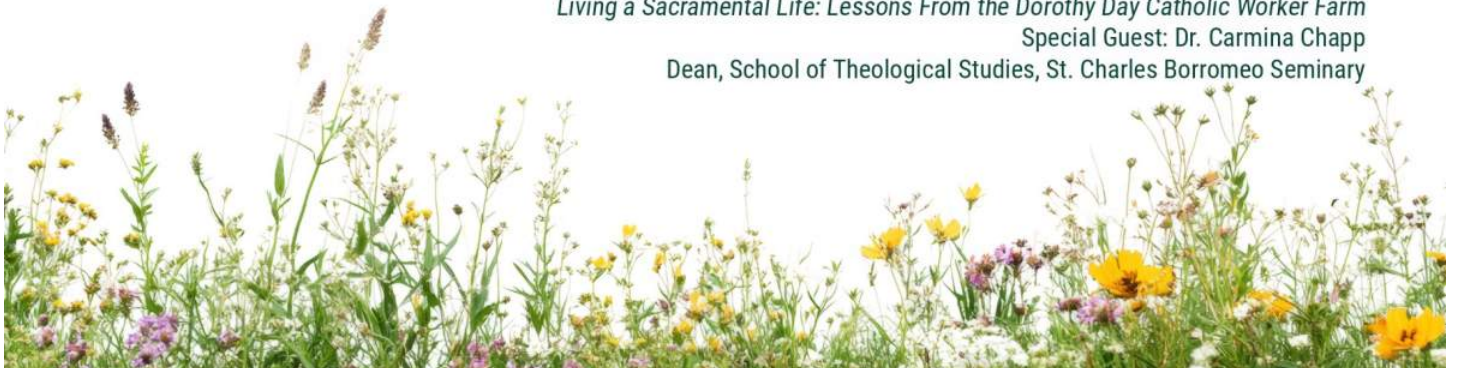

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our children are God’s great gift to us. Each April, we observe National Child Abuse Prevention Month which serves as a reminder that we must continue the ongoing work of raising awareness while also recommitting ourselves to protecting our children who are so vulnerable. At the same time, we also renew our commitment to assist survivors of abuse, especially at the hands of a clergy member, as they seek healing and peace.

One case of abuse is too many, yet the National Children’s Alliance reports that more than 550,000 children in the United States are known to have been abused in recent years. The majority of that abuse, 76%, was at the hands of a trusted adult, like a parent or guardian.¹ These staggering numbers remind us of the need for vigilance and compassion; these are real lives, real families shattered by trauma, and the often-unseen real scars that last a lifetime. Beyond immediate harm, abuse contributes to long-term challenges, including mental health issues, substance abuse, and difficulties in establishing relationships. For every child affected, an additional circle of family and community endures silent suffering, perpetuating cycles of trauma across generations.

During a meeting for “The Protection of Minors in the Church,” Pope Francis said, “The Church’s aim will thus be to hear, watch over, protect and care for abused, exploited and forgotten children, wherever they are. To achieve that goal, the Church must rise above the ideological disputes and journalistic practices that often exploit, for various interests, the very tragedy experienced by the little ones.”² We need to protect every child as if he or she is a member of our own family.

Regrettably, our own Diocese has had experiences of trusted adults who engaged in these sinful acts. We will never stop being vigilant to ensure that, as much as possible, all children and vulnerable adults in our care are protected. Assuring that our parishes and institutions are truly safe environments for children has been, and must *always* be, a principal priority for our Diocese. So, not only during the month of April, but throughout the year, we renew our resolve to do all that we can to prevent child abuse.

As Bishop, I am proud to continue the shared efforts of a multifaceted Diocesan-wide strategy aimed at prevention, support, and healing. I can confidently report that we have implemented robust training programs for our clergy and lay leaders, educating them about the signs of abuse and the critical steps to take to address it, and, as indicated, report it appropriately to law enforcement. As of 2024, 15,346 students enrolled in Catholic schools in the Diocese or in parish religious education programs have received the VIRTUS Safe Environment training; 146 priests, along with 73 permanent deacons and 27 candidates for ordination (seminarians and candidates for the permanent diaconate) have completed background checks
