SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Father Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

Hempfield Food Pantry News



What a remarkable example of generosity by the people of St. Leo's we experienced with the April collection of food for the Hempfield Food Pantry. It was the largest amount ever given - 1,339 pounds. St. Leo's school donated an additional 352 pounds. What a blessing this is for local people facing food insecurity. During the month of March the pantry served a total of 1,979 people and 51 volunteers gave 661 hours of service. Thank you and may God bless you abundantly.

Requested food items for our next collection, **May 3rd & 4th**, are: canned corn, canned tuna, mac and cheese, 1 pound bags white rice, 1 pound bags lentils, cereal, pancake mix, syrup, canned beet and canned pineapple. No green beans are needed!

HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!

We come together on this most glorious day, the Day of the Resurrection, this Easter Sunday of 2025, seeking to again experience in our hearts that inexplicable joy at the event of Our Lord, after the horror of the Cross, now risen in glory. Indeed, the Son of God has taken our humanity to offer it on His Cross, and after suffering death, now shows to us the eternal life that He has come to give to us.

There is no other event in all of human history comparable to this. This event changes everything! It started last evening, as our 3 Elect were baptized at our Easter Vigil, and so we pray for them and all of us that this Season may be one filled with joy and peace.

On a personal note, I want to express my heartfelt thanks to so many of you who have done so much over the past weeks to make our Easter celebration so wonderful – Ginny Pryor, and her group of volunteers, who have decorated our Sanctuary with such beauty; Kyle Postlethwait and the Choir and our Cantors and musicians, all our Altar Servers and Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, to Deacon Frank, Sister Dorothy and the Sponsors in the OCIA Process, who have given so much of their time; and so many others who are so active in our Parish in so many ways.

Most importantly, I want to thank all in our Parish for your great witness of faith. I have been particularly inspired by those throughout Lent who did so much, the great number who have come to receive God’s mercy in the Sacrament of Confession, for me to serve as that instrument of God’s mercy to you is so humbling and grace filled.

I pray for all, that as our Lenten journey was hopefully a time of preparation, now this Season of Easter may be one filled with God’s blessings, that in all our sufferings and trials, we can keep our focus on where Easter points, to the empty tomb, and to our Savior risen in glory and that promise of eternal life it gives to each of us. Church Teachings on In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) and Opportunities for Support

On February 18, 2025, President Donald Trump issued an executive order expanding access to, and reducing the financial burden of, in vitro fertilization (IVF). The justification was simple: "Providing support, awareness, and access to affordable fertility treatments can help these families navigate their path to parenthood with hope and confidence." Championed as part of the Administration's strong pro-family stance, the executive order nevertheless undermines the dignity of the human person and the family by proposing fertility as a biomedical commodity.

The USCCB's Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities and Catholic ministries like Springs in the Desert provide a wealth of resources to assist the faithful in understanding the complex and heavy cross of infertility as well as the theological and medical reasons why the use of IVF and other assistive reproductive technologies are not permitted by the Church. At the most recent Clergy Day, priests of our Diocese received Springs in the Desert's newest resource, "Dignity in Conception." The USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities recently shared several resources that will enable parish staff, ministry leaders, and the faithful in your community to learn more about this sensitive issue. Urbi Et Orbi Message of His Holiness Pope St. John Paul II (Easter Sunday, April 11, 2004)

1. *"Resurrexit, alleluia - He is risen, alleluia!"* This year too the joyous proclamation of Easter, which echoed powerfully at last night's Vigil, strengthens our hope. *"Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen"* (Lk 24:5-6). Thus the angel encourages the women who have hastened to the tomb. Thus the Easter liturgy repeats to us, the men and women of the third millennium: Christ is risen, Christ is alive among us! His name now is "the Living One", death has no more power over him (cf. Rom 6:9).

2. *Resurrexit!* Today you, O Redeemer of mankind, rise victoriously from the tomb to offer to us, troubled by many threatening shadows, your wish for joy and peace. Those who are tempted by anxiety and desperation turn to you, O Christ, our life and our guide, to hear the proclamation of the hope that does not disappoint. On this day of your victory over death, may humanity find in you, O Lord, the courage to oppose in solidarity the many evils that afflict it. In particular, may it find the strength to face the inhuman, and unfortunately growing, phenomenon of terrorism, which rejects life and brings anguish and uncertainty to the daily lives of so many hard-working and peaceful people. May your wisdom enlighten men and women of good will in the required commitment against this scourge.

3. May the work of national and international institutions hasten the overcoming of the present difficulties and favour progress towards a more effective and peaceful world order. May world leaders be confirmed and sustained in their efforts to resolve satisfactorily the continuing conflicts that cause bloodshed in certain regions of Africa, Iraq and the Holy Land. You, firstborn of many brothers, grant that all who consider themselves children of Abraham may rediscover the brotherhood that they share and that prompts in them designs of cooperation and peace.

4. Take heed all of you who have at heart mankind's future! Take heed men and women of good will! May the temptation to seek revenge give way to the courage to forgive; may the culture of life and love render vain the logic of death; may trust once more give breath to the lives of peoples. If our future is one, it is the task and duty of all to build it with patient and painstaking far-sightedness.

5. *"Lord, to whom shall we go?"* You who have conquered death, you alone *"have the words of eternal life"* (Jn 6:68). To you we raise with confidence our prayer which becomes an invocation of comfort for the families of the many victims of violence. Help us to work ceaselessly for the coming of that more just and united world that you have inaugurated with your resurrection. Accompanying us in this task is *"she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her from the Lord"* (Lk 1:45). Blessed are you, O Mary, silent witness of Easter! You, O Mother of the Crucified One now risen, who at the hour of pain and death kept the flame of hope burning, teach us also to be, amongst the incongruities of passing time, convinced and joyful witnesses of the eternal message of life and love brought to the world by the Risen Redeemer.

The conditions in number 2 can be fulfilled a few days before or after performing the works below to gain the indulgence, but it is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed.

Complete one of the following six works:



Undertake a pious pilgrimage to one of the Diocesan Sacred Sites and completing one of the following:

- a. devoutly participating in Holy Mass or the Anointing of the Sick
- b. a celebration of the Word of God;
- c. the Liturgy of the Hours
- d. the Way of the Cross;
- e. the Marian Rosary;
- f. a penitential celebration, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents.



Carry out a corporal or spiritual work of mercy



Carry out a work of Penance

Such as abstaining, fasting, donating money to the poor, by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defence, protection and quality of life in all its phases, or by volunteering free time to activities that are of service to the community.



By devoutly visiting one of the Diocesan Sacred Sites

For a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Apostles Creed, and the Hail Mary.



Participate in Missions, Spiritual Exercises or formation activities,

with a devout spirit, on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place.



Those who are sick or cannot participate for serious reasons, can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence

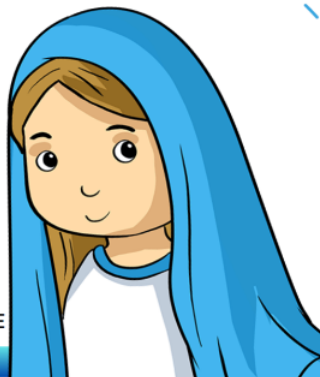
