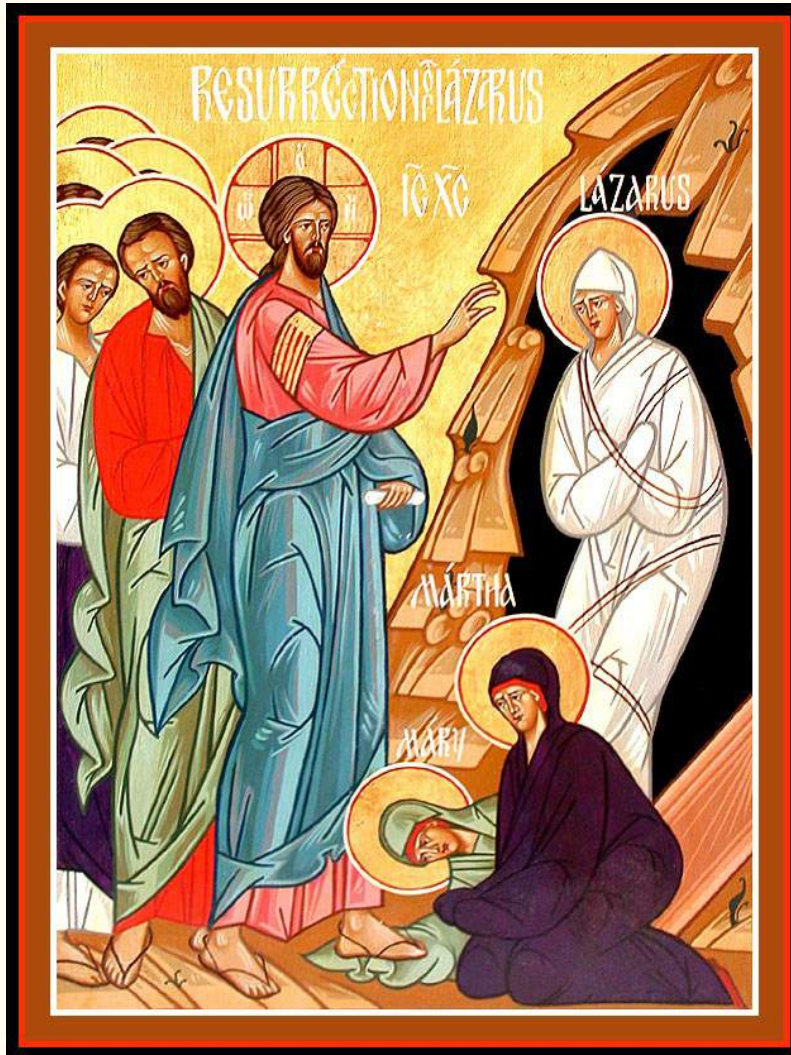

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Father Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Father Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

**“I will open your graves and have you rise from them . . .
I will put my spirit in you that you may live . . .
I have promised it and I will do it, says the Lord”
(Ezekiel 37:12; 14)**

We gather today on this Fifth Sunday of Lent, that last Sunday before we begin those most solemn days of the year next Sunday which begins Holy Week.

Hopefully, our Lent has been a good one but I think we all know how sometimes, our Lenten journeys are filled with unfulfilled promises and plans. We know how sometimes, we have failed in some of our resolutions but hopefully, we also have experienced the grace and joy of some fulfilled acts of prayer and penance.

Our Readings today are meant to give us assurances from God, that whatever we have done or failed to do, He is there always to strengthen us and to console us. In light of what we hear in these Readings then, we are now called to “start again” for these last two weeks, confident, not in our own efforts but in the grace of God.

These words above from our First Reading show this. Ezekiel writes while the Chosen People are in Exile. They have failed to follow the Lord and be faithful to the Covenant He had established with them. Jerusalem had been destroyed in 587 BC, but he now prophesies about a “new covenant” and restoration that God will accomplish. While this happens when the People return from the Exile and the Temple is rebuilt, it, more importantly, symbolizes the ultimate “restoration” accomplished in Christ.

Our Gospel then shows us the great event of the raising of Lazarus from the dead, which prefigures the Resurrection but I think an even better aspect of this Gospel is what happens to those others around Lazarus, who represent us who so often have to deal with the suffering and death of loved ones.

We are told that Mary “sat at home”. Isn’t that us sometimes and perhaps, that might be all we can do, just grieve in silence seeking that consolation in prayer that only the Lord can give? Martha goes “to meet Jesus” and cries out, “Lord, if you would have been here, my brother would not have died.” Isn’t that our sentiments sometimes as we cry out to the Lord when tragedy affects us? But again, here the Lord consoles her, revealing to her that He is “the Resurrection and the Life”, promising eternal life to all who believe in Him. And then there is the crowd. Can we imagine their reaction when Lazarus, who had died, comes forth from the tomb?

And so, today, let us begin anew our Lenten Journey. I want to thank all who have contributed to our Diocesan Annual Campaign, formerly known as the Lenten Appeal and to urge all who have not yet done so, to please give.

May God bless all of you for your generosity. May each of us now “re-commit” to these last days of this Lent, to grow closer to Christ, to be filled in the consolation that He alone can give, to then joyfully celebrate the glory of Easter and that incomparable gift of Eternal Life offered to us in the Resurrection of Christ.
