SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

Hempfield Food Pantry



Thank you to everyone who generously donated to our June food collection for the Hempfield Area Food Pantry. A total of 1,138 pounds of food were delivered to the pantry on June 9th. It’s such a blessing for individuals and families who are struggling to have access to a reliable source of good food. In May the pantry served 1,1626 people - 449 children, 821 adults and 356 seniors.

The next collection is **July 5th-6th**. Requested items: 1 lb. bags of white rice, cereal, spaghetti sauce (large and regular) canned tuna, canned salmon, canned corn, Beefaroni, penne and rigatoni pasta, elbow macaroni and Mac & Cheese.

“The Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said ‘This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.’” (I Cor 11:23-24)

Today, we gather on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ hopefully, as we do every Sunday, to marvel at the incomparable Gift that is ours in this Most Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. We hear these words from Saint Paul in our Second Reading recalling the events of the Last Supper and then, in our Gospel, we hear of the Miracle of the Multiplication of the Loaves and the Fish, the only miracle performed by Jesus that is recorded in all four Gospels, and see how it is a prefiguring of those events of the Last Supper.

We all know I think that the word “Eucharist” is derived from the Greek word “eucharistein” which means “thanksgiving”. When we come to Mass, our hearts are meant to be filled with the greatest gratitude as we are brought into this most wonderful event of communion with the Living God. Jesus offers His life on the cross to save us from our sins and He rises from the dead to show us the eternal life meant for all of us in Him. What other conceivable response could we utter other than one of thanksgiving?

The Church teaches that the Eucharist is the “source and summit of the entire Christian life.” And we are meant to see how our entire life of faith, in the words from the Second Vatican Council, is “bound up with the Eucharist and directed toward it; for in the Most Blessed Eucharist is contained the entire spiritual wealth of the Church, namely Christ Himself our Pasch and our living Bread, who gives life to humanity through His flesh”.

We see how in the miracle in our Gospel Jesus first asks His disciples to “give them some food yourselves” and then to see how, at its conclusion “all are satisfied”. This shows that our reception of the Holy Eucharist is meant to involve us. We see how Jesus, both at the Last Supper and in the Miracle of our Gospel, “takes”, “blesses” breaks” and “gives” and so, we see how we then live out our communion with Him, in this four-part process. We are “taken”, as our lives are given to us, we are “blessed” in the life of faith received in Baptism, we are “broken” in those sufferings that are ours, and then are called to “give” in our lives of love and service to one another.

Last Saturday evening, our Parish gathered to mark my being named a Monsignor. It was a celebration filled with joy and thanksgiving, as we also reflected upon how in this Jubilee Year, all of us are called to live as “Pilgrims of Hope”. I want to personally express my sincere thanks to all who joined in that celebration, all who have given gifts and cards of congratulations to me, and especially to all who worked so hard in the preparation and serving of the dinner that we shared.

God blesses us each day with countless gifts and the greatest of His blessings is the Gift of Himself in this Holy Eucharist. May we be filled with joy and thanksgiving at this wondrous Gift and through our communion with Him, continue to grow in our communion with one another. God bless you.

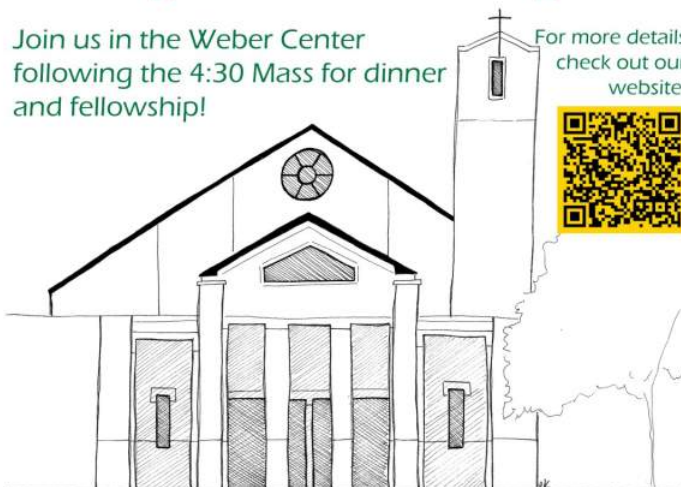

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today, we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday, a Feast Day dedicated to honoring the profound mystery of our faith: the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This day serves as an essential reminder of the deep love and commitment that God has to each one of us, as He is truly, really, and substantially present under the humble appearances of bread and wine.

Today also begins Religious Freedom Week, coinciding with the feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher. Having the freedom to gather to celebrate our religious beliefs is a great blessing and one that this week calls us to remember.

Religious freedom empowers us to live out our beliefs openly and serves as a beacon of hope for many. It allows the Church, and all religious communities, to express their faith in public and contribute positively to the fabric of our society. However, while we celebrate this fundamental right, we must also confront a stark reality - the existence of religious persecution and hatred that persists across the globe. Many, including those right here in our communities, face discrimination, oppression, and violence simply for their beliefs. As we reflect on our blessings, please remember those who are being silenced and marginalized.

This week, I encourage each of you to learn more about the importance of religious freedom. Share stories with your family and friends, educate others about the realities of religious persecution, and encourage our government leaders to strengthen laws that protect this sacred right.

Embrace this Religious Freedom Week with open hearts and determined spirits. Together, we can develop an environment where every individual feels safe to express their beliefs. During this Jubilee Year of Hope, may we be witnesses to hope, united in our mission to uphold the dignity and freedom of all peoples of faith.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In my almost two years as your Bishop, I have witnessed and experienced the vibrant life of the Church here in the Diocese of Harrisburg. The commitment of our clergy, the passion from our Catholic school administrators and teachers, the dedication of our parish and Diocesan staff, and the deep faith from you, the faithful, are visible everywhere I go.

We have great opportunities in our Diocese to strengthen and expand the life of our local Church. Focusing these priorities has been a goal of our work with Catholic Leadership Institute, which included the Disciple Maker Index in the fall of 2024. The results of this survey have been analyzed, and we are in the final steps of developing a Pastoral Plan, which will outline priorities and goals for our Diocese over the next several years in the areas of faith formation, proclaiming the Gospel, and engaging our youth and young adults/young families in a more active, personal way. As Pope Leo observed: "Ours is a time marked by a growing search for spirituality, particularly evident in young people, who are longing for authentic relationships and guides in life. Hence, it is important that the Christian community be farsighted in discerning the challenges of today's world and in nurturing the desire for faith present in the heart of every man and woman." (*Message to Participants in the Seminar "Evangelizing with the Families of Today and Tomorrow: Ecclesiological and Pastoral Challenges," May 28, 2025*)

It has become clear through this process that, while the opportunity and desire to renew our Diocese moving forward is there, the resources of the Diocese are limited. To that end, we have partnered with the Steier Group, a national Catholic fundraising and development firm from Omaha, Nebraska, to conduct a Feasibility Study for a Diocesan capital campaign. I have engaged the Steier Group, having received the counsel and support of our priests who serve as Deans and members of our College of Consultors and Presbyteral Council to undertake this Study. I have also subsequently received support for this initiative from our Diocesan Finance Council. A feasibility study typically serves as a first step to a possible capital campaign. We have made no commitments to a Diocesan-wide campaign at this time, and it is important to highlight that this Study does not oblige the Diocese to initiate such a campaign. Instead, the Study will equip us with both an assessment of our current ministry endeavors and provide essential information regarding the feasibility of launching a campaign, should we decide to proceed.

The Steier Group was selected to partner with the Diocese because of their extensive experience working with Catholic organizations. With this partnership, we are taking steps to grow and sustain the ministries and mission of our Diocese for years to come.

The preparation for the Feasibility Study will begin in late June, with the main portion of the Study commencing in January 2026. During this preparation phase, the Diocese will be gathering background information and constructing the surveys and online questionnaires. From January through April 2026, personal interviews with all pastors and key constituents will be conducted. At the conclusion of the planning Study, the Diocese will have the results needed to make an informed decision regarding the practicality of moving forward with a comprehensive fundraising effort to fund specific initiatives identified as needs by both our clergy and you, the faithful.

As we move through this process, updates will be provided concerning the status of our progress. Thank you for your continued faith and devotion. I ask that you join me in prayer for this initiative and invoke the intercession of Our Blessed Mother, Mary, Mother of the Church, Saint Joseph and Saint Patrick, our patron.
