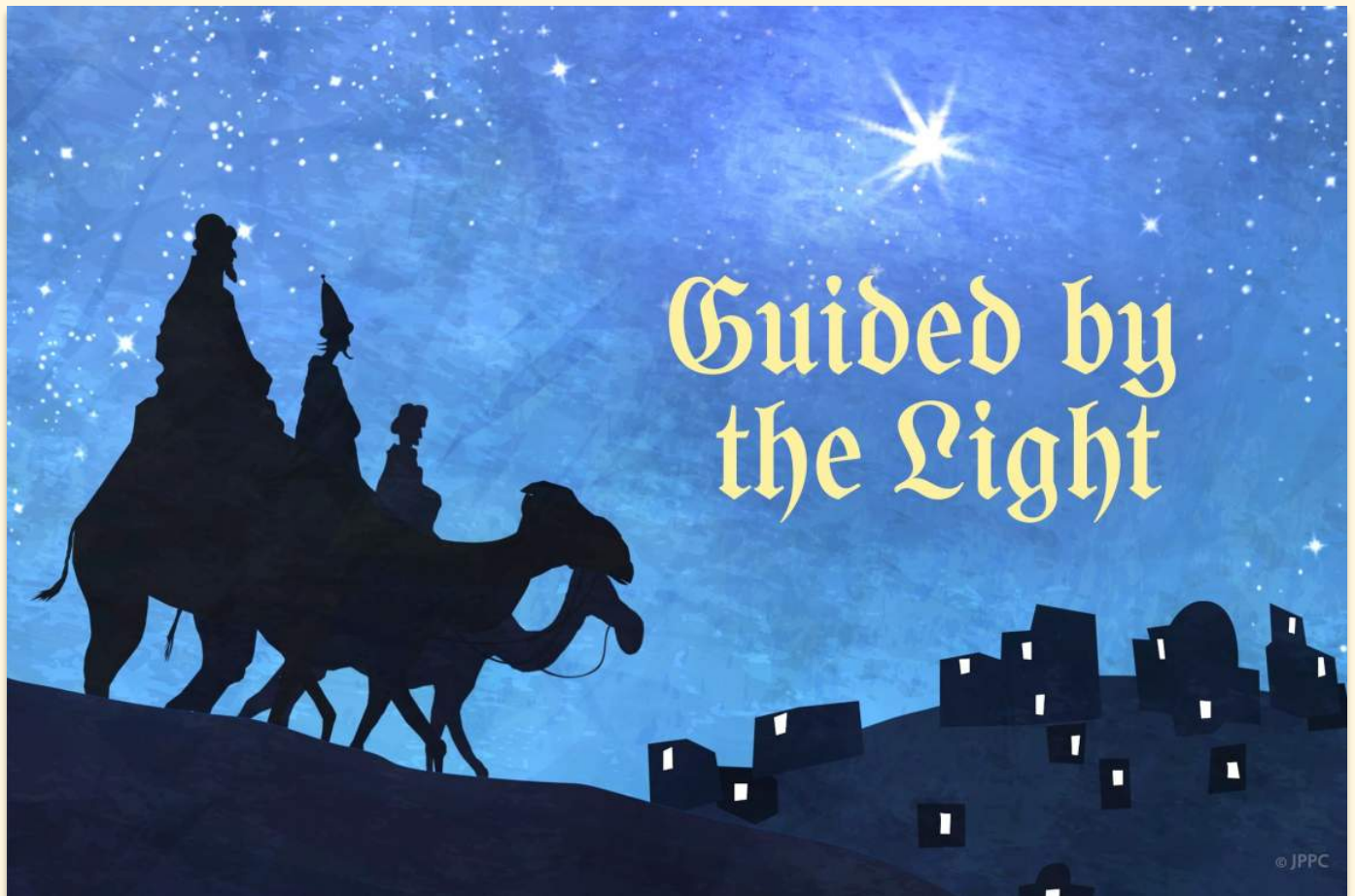

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

“They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the Child with Mary His mother. They prostrated themselves and did Him homage.” (Matthew: 2:10-11)

We come today on this “eleventh day of Christmas”, which for us, is not just a day but a Season, this year lasting for another full week until next Sunday’s Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. We continue in our celebration of this greatest gift and greatest mystery imaginable, that God Himself, is born among us so that He can suffer and die for us and then rise from the dead to show us that eternal life He offers to us in Him.

The Event of Christmas is one that we are not just to “observe” or “recall”, thinking back to what happened over 2000 years ago, but to actually “experience it”, here and now as He remains with us in the life of the Church and her Sacraments, so that each day we might grow in an ever more intimate communion in Him.

Saint Athanasius, a 4th Century Bishop of Alexandria and Doctor of the Church, writes this remarkable truth, that “God became Man so that man might become God.” It is a shocking statement that we have to be clear not to misinterpret. Of course, we cannot “become God” in His essence and His identity, but all of us are meant to be transformed by the power of His presence and His grace to become “like Him”, to grow in those attributes that He possesses perfectly in those 12 Fruits of the Holy Spirit that adorn the side of the walls of the nave of our Church, to live in Him, and with Him and like Him more and more each day.

Today’s title of our Feast, “Epiphany”, derives from the Greek word meaning “appearance or manifestation.” The Wise Men from the East come and do Him homage. They represent all of us, those outside the “Chosen People”. This event shows that now, after His birth, all peoples throughout the world are invited to be “His People” and know the new life He has come to bring.

Again, we celebrate this Feast as a continuation of Christmas. For while Christmas calls us to rejoice at our Lord’s birth, the Epiphany brings us to celebrate the recognition of who this Child is; the Son of God, the Promised Messiah who will save us from our sins. We hear in today’s Gospel that they offered to Him their treasures of gold, frankincense and myrrh, “gold” to symbolize that He is a King, “frankincense” to give praise to God, and “myrrh” to point to the death that He will suffer for us.

We too are called to do the same at every Mass, to come and prostrate ourselves before Him and do Him homage, not giving Him gold, frankincense and myrrh, but giving our hearts, minds and desires, in striving always to love and serve Him. Indeed, this is the way we can “become like Him” and then, to know that joy and happiness, now and then one day forever, that He alone can give. Merry Christmas.
