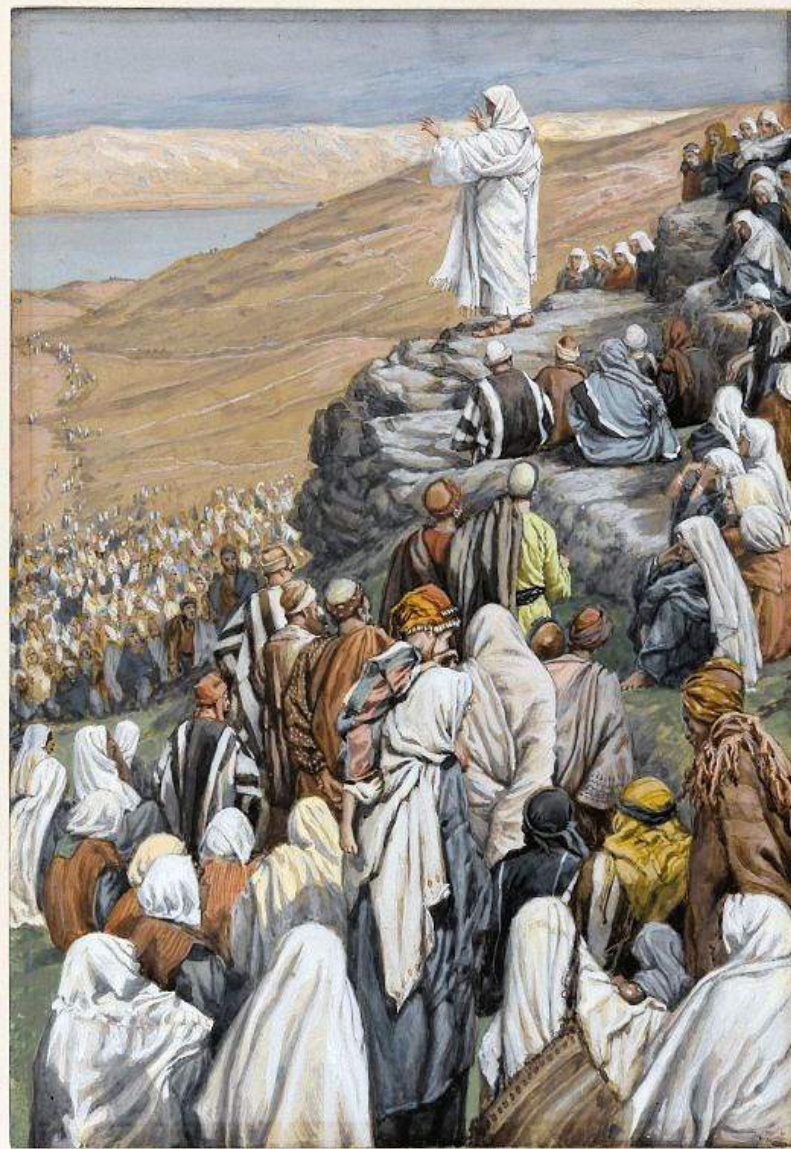




## February 15, 2026 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

**“Do not think I have come to abolish the law or the prophets.  
I have come not to abolish but to fulfill.” (Matt 5:17)**

Today, now for the third consecutive Sunday, we hear from the beginning of one of the most famous passages in all of Sacred Scripture, the Sermon on the Mount, found in Chapters 5, 6, and 7 of Saint Matthew’s Gospel. It is an exhaustive and comprehensive exhortation of Our Lord as to how we are meant to live our lives of faith. Two weeks ago, we heard from the beginning of the Sermon, the Beatitudes. Last Sunday, we heard the call for us to be “salt” and “light” to our world. And today, we hear Jesus imploring us to live most fully, His law of love, not in an external or legalistic way, but in allowing His grace to change our hearts, to make them more pure so that all our actions may be motivated by love of Him and one another.

Of course, we all need to be attentive to this call and we all need to constantly seek to be renewed, to turn from those sinful ways that can plague. And, this week, all of us will begin that time of “conversion”, that sacred season of Lent, called to be drawn more deeply into the suffering of Christ so to be freed from those disordered inclinations.

Many of us will come to Mass this Wednesday to begin our Lenten Journey, to receive ashes, that sign that our earthly life will one day end, that sign that we are called to a time of repentance, to seek the forgiveness of our sins so that we might be brought through this life to the eternal glory of heaven. Lent is a time for us to seek that deeper communion with our Heavenly Father, to ask for His forgiveness, to engage in concrete expressions of that sorrow by prayer and fasting and almsgiving, so to grow in our communion with Him.

Our lives are precious gifts to us by God. We have so many interests and activities, that are good but can sometimes turn our focus from the essential purpose and meaning of every human life – to come to know God, to love Him and to serve Him so that we might know a measure of happiness here on earth, and then, one day, forever in His Kingdom of Heaven.

Lent will offer us several opportunities to eliminate those “distractions” and come to a deeper union in Christ. First and foremost, I recommend our annual Forty Hours Devotions, which will be held on March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. Each day, our Eucharistic Lord will be enthroned in the Monstrance on our Altar in our Main Church for Adoration from after our last Mass until 7:00 p.m. Sign-up sheets will be available so that we can commit a half hour or more to silent prayer, to allow Him to speak to us in silence and offer us His consolation and peace.

Stations of the Cross will be held each Friday evening at 7:00 p.m. and at 2:15 for our School Children. On Friday evenings, we will gather for simple Lenten Meals in our Parish Hall to share time together before coming to Stations. Our Parish Penance Service will be held on March 24<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. and I anticipate that, as usual, we will have 10 Priests to assist us.

Let us, as we begin Lent, embrace its call to “prayer, fasting and almsgiving” so that we might be changed by the power of His grace, so to more fully interiorize His call to live more deeply each day His law of love. God bless you.

# LENT 2026

## “You are looking for Jesus who was Crucified.” *Matthew 28:5*

Before we look for Jesus on the morning of the Resurrection, we spend these forty days of Lent looking for Jesus in prayer, penance, and charity.



Lent precedes and prepares for Easter. It is a time to hear the Word of God, to turn away from sin, to prepare for and remember Baptism, to be reconciled with God and one's neighbor, and to make more frequent recourse to the "weapons of Christian penance": prayer, fasting and good works (cf. Mt 6, 1-6. 16-18).

The Sacred Liturgy express a mystical aspect of Lent through its great themes or values, such a relationship between "the sacrament of forty days" and "the sacraments of Christian Initiation", and the mystery of the "Exodus" which is always present in the Lenten journey. Popular piety concentrates in a special way on the mysteries of Christ's humanity, and during Lent the faithful pay close attention to the Passion and Death of Our Lord.

In the Roman Rite, the start of the forty days of penance is marked with the austere symbol of ashes which are used in the Sacred Liturgy of Ash Wednesday. The use of ashes is a survival from an ancient rite

according to which converted sinners submitted themselves to canonical penance. The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the Baptized are called during Lent. The faithful who come to receive ashes should be assisted in perceiving the implicit internal significance of this act, which disposes them towards conversion and renewed Easter commitment.

Notwithstanding the secularization of contemporary society, the Christian faithful, during Lent, are clearly conscious of the need to turn the mind towards those realities which really count, which require Gospel commitment and integrity of life which, through self-denial of those things which are superfluous, are translated into good works and solidarity with the poor and needy.

Those of the faithful who infrequently attend the sacraments of Penance and the Holy Eucharist should be aware

of the long ecclesial tradition associating the precept of confessing grave sins and receive Holy Communion at least once during the Lenten season, or preferably during Eastertide.

There can be an effective and fruitful interaction between Sacred Liturgy and popular piety during the forty days of Lent.

An example of such interaction is to be seen in fact that popular piety often encourages particular observances on certain days, or special devotional exercises, or apostolic or charitable works which are foreseen and recommended by the Lenten Liturgy. The practice of fasting, characteristic of the Lenten season since antiquity, is an "exercise" which frees the faithful from earthly concerns so as to discover the life that comes from above: "Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God" (cf. Dt 8,3; Mt 4, 4; Lk 4,4; antiphon for the first Sunday of Lent).


