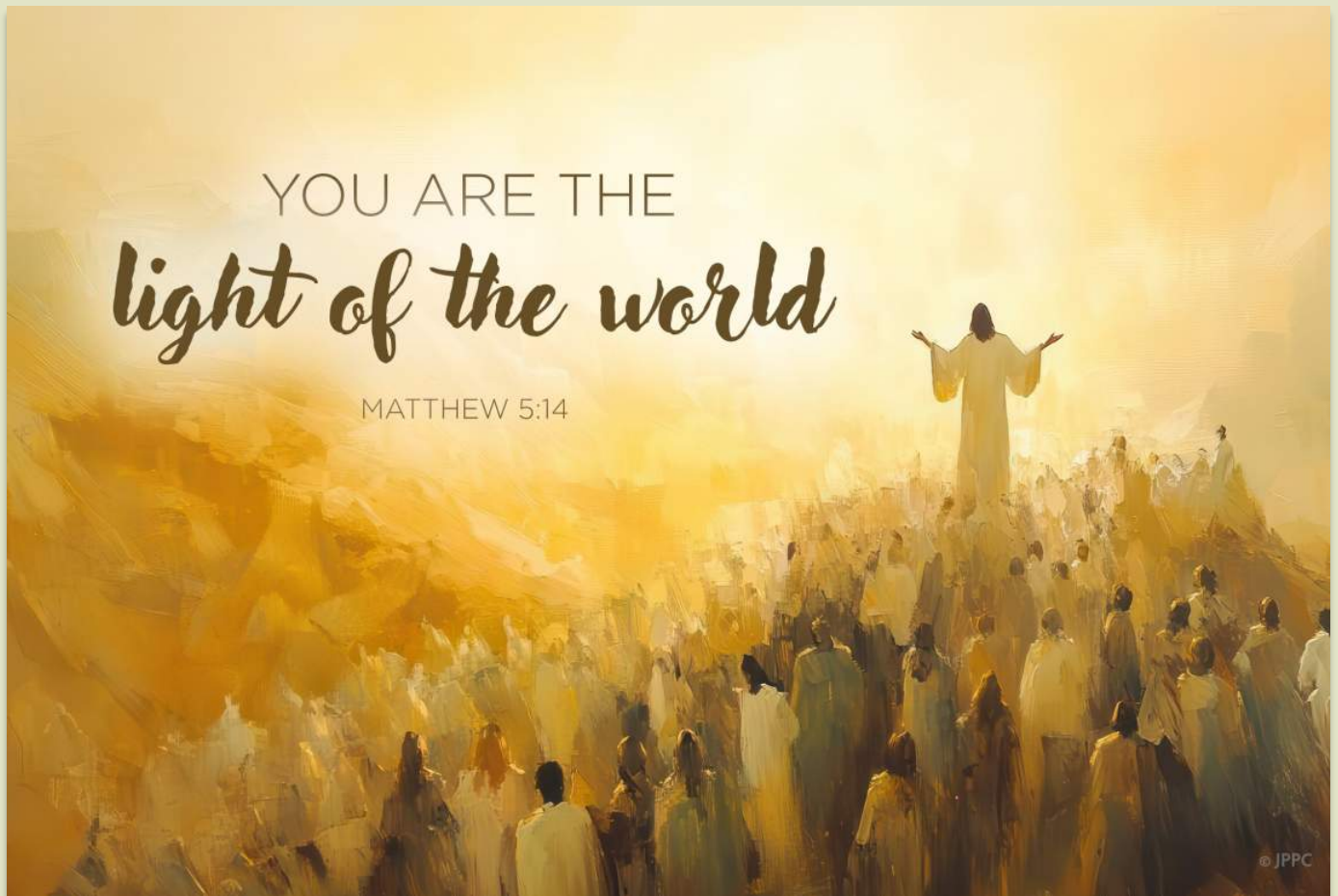

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active registered members of the parish and who are receiving the Sacraments on a regular basis.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On February 11, as we commemorate the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, the Church observes the World Day of the Sick. This annual day was established in 1992, by Pope Saint John Paul II, himself a witness to suffering through Parkinson's disease. He authorized that it be celebrated on February 11 to honor the countless sick pilgrims who have journeyed to the shrine at Lourdes, seeking healing in its waters, and experiencing cures attributed to the intercession of our Blessed Mother.

On this World Day of the Sick, I offer my own heartfelt prayers and blessings to all those who are enduring physical, mental, or spiritual challenges. Having recently undergone a hip replacement, I have gained a deeper understanding and appreciation for the daily struggles many of you face. May the compassionate love of our Lord bring you hope, comfort, and strength. In your moments of pain, suffering, or uncertainty, remember that you are never alone as Christ walks with you, and the Church holds you close to Her heart in prayer.

I also offer my profound gratitude to all the caregivers, medical professionals, family members, and volunteers who serve the sick with unwavering compassion and dedication. In his first *World Day of the Sick Message*, Pope Leo called to mind the Good Samaritan who was "moved with pity" for the man who was robbed and wounded saying that "Compassion, in this sense, implies a profound emotion that compels us to act. It is a feeling that springs from within and leads to a committed response to another's suffering. In this parable, compassion is the defining characteristic of active love; it is neither theoretical nor merely sentimental but manifests itself through concrete gestures. The Samaritan *drew near, tended the wounds, took charge and provided care.*" As healthcare providers, family, and friends, your selfless witness embodies the healing presence of Christ to those most in need.

Together, we unite in prayer for healing, serenity, courage, and confidence, trusting in God's providence and the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes. May this day inspire us all to show greater love and solidarity with all those who are suffering.

May we also heed Pope Leo's invitation: "Let us raise our prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Health of the Sick, asking her to assist all who suffer and are in need of compassion, consolation, and a listening ear. Let us seek her intercession with this ancient prayer, that has been invoked in families for those living with illness and pain: Sweet Mother, do not part from me. Turn not your eyes away from me. Walk with me at every moment and never leave me alone. You who always protect me as a true Mother, obtain for me the blessing of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Message of Pope Leo XIV for the 34th World Day of the Sick 2026)."

May we continue to support one another with faith and compassion, trusting that God's love and grace will sustain us through every trial.

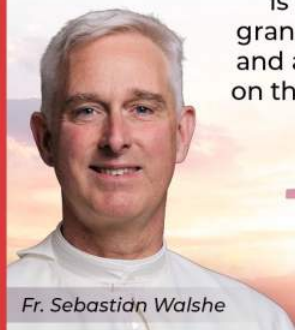
