Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We prayed these words as we processed at Mass today, on this Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally known as “Laetare Sunday”, “laetare” being the Latin word that begins this Antiphon, which means “rejoice”. We are now more than halfway into our Lenten Journey, three and a half weeks since we began on Ash Wednesday, with now only two more weeks until we begin Holy Week.

Our Gospel is well known to us, the account of Our Lord’s healing of the blind man. There is the contrast between him and the Pharisees, between those who “know” of their blindness and those who do not.

Remember that in the Scriptures, all physical infirmity was seen as connected to the spiritual infirmity of sin, so as the blind man is given his sight, on a much more important level, he is led to a much greater healing in the spiritual realm, a relationship with Christ.

And so, we can see how that is for us. For, each of us is “blind” in some way because of own wounded condition of Original Sin. Sometimes, the blindness can be like that of the Pharisees, always looking to others and judging them without ever looking at or recognizing our “lack” and our need for a deeper relationship with Christ. We are “blinded” since we are consumed by what others do or don’t do, instead of having the “sight” to see clearly our sin.

And then, at an even deeper level, we are “blinded” since we don’t see God’s presence and His guiding hand in all things. We only see the outer expression of things and fail, in faith, to remember that all that happens is mysteriously part of His plan. And then, we are filled with all sorts of anxieties and angers since things “are not the way we want them to be.” Can’t we see how that way of looking at things is directly contrary to what we prayed today in our Responsorial Psalm, from Psalm 23, that most well-known of all the Psalms; “The Lord is my Shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.”

In our Second Reading today, St. Paul urges us to “live as children of the light”. It is what you and I are called to do, in a most special way during this season of Lent, through our prayer, fasting and almsgiving, to deny ourselves of those things that can lead us into darkness so to experience, more and more, Christ’s Light.

So, where is the “blindness” that plagues us? And what sins continue to leave us in the darkness? Next Tuesday, March 24th, we will celebrate our Parish Lenten Penance Service. Our reception of this Sacrament of Penance is indispensable to our growth in the faith. Otherwise, we will be like the Pharisees who think they “see” and have no need for healing. Let’s not fall into that trap. Let’s acknowledge our blindness so that we might be given sight, to see the truth, to then “rejoice” now and always in the infinite mercy of God and the healing that He alone can give.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we approach Saint Patrick's Day, I invite you to reflect on the words of Saint Patrick, "If I have any worth, it is to live my life for God." These words, written in a letter to soldiers, are words that we, as Catholics and people of good will, can reflect on in our everyday lives for they remind us of our profound calling to serve with humility and courage.

Saint Patrick's journey — from being kidnapped and sold into slavery in Ireland as a teenager, to escaping and returning home to England, and then choosing to return as a missionary to the very people who once enslaved him — teaches us the power of forgiveness and unwavering trust in Christ. He returned to those who once enslaved him, not with resentment, but with a heart open to reconciliation and a message of hope. His sacrifices and perseverance transformed lives and brought many to the faith.

Pope Leo, in his message for World Mission Day, reminds us, "In many situations, we encounter conflicts, polarization, misunderstandings and a lack of mutual trust. When this occurs even within our communities, it undermines our witness. The evangelizing mission that Christ entrusted to his disciples requires, above all, hearts that are reconciled and eager for communion."¹

Today, we face our own challenges: wars wounding the human family, political differences straining relationships, many families carrying quiet burdens of hurt and division, and misunderstandings even among fellow believers. In these moments, Saint Patrick's witness calls us not to deepen divisions, but to heal them. We are called to be builders of communion, instruments of reconciliation, and servants of peace. He listened for the voice of God, even when it led him beyond what was familiar and comfortable. He heard the cry of a people and returned to them with the hope of the Gospel. Like Saint Patrick, we are invited to listen for God's voice, to step beyond what is comfortable, and to respond to the quiet cries for hope, for mercy, and healing in our midst. The Lord sends us as He sent Saint Patrick — not always across oceans, but into our neighborhoods, our workplaces, our parishes, and even our own homes — to bring the peace of Christ where it is most needed.

This is a moment to live our faith boldly and joyfully, with greater conviction, and without fear. Together, may we be recognized as followers of Jesus, confident that He walks with us — men and women whose words, actions, and attitudes reflect His presence, bringing hope, mercy, and healing wherever it is needed. I encourage you to join me in renewing our commitment to the Gospel: to open our hearts more fully to the Holy Spirit, who rekindles within us the gift of faith; to allow that gift to shape how we live and love; and to carry, with quiet confidence and joyful hope, the unifying message of Christ into our divided world. May Saint Patrick's example strengthen us to share the Good News, welcome the stranger, and care for the most vulnerable among us. May God bless you and your families abundantly.

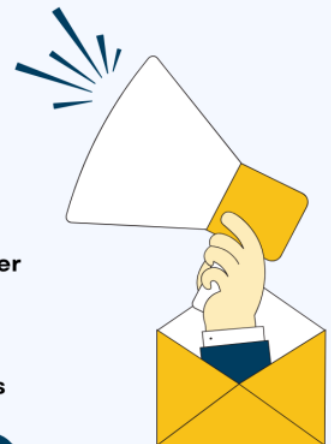

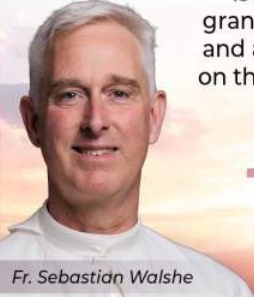
