SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

“Jesus told her, ‘I am the Resurrection and the Life; whoever believes in Me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.’” (John 11:25)

Today, we come together on this Fifth Sunday of Lent, the last Sunday before we will begin Holy Week, those most solemn days of our Liturgical Year.

Hopefully, our Lent has been a good one but I expect that many of us have had unfulfilled hopes and plans. Those “failures” are not meant to deter us or depress us. We are called to humbly and honestly acknowledge those and to turn to Christ again, to see His strength and His grace. We are always called to look beyond what we have done or failed to do, and to look at what He has done and always desires to do for us.

Our Gospel today is a great example of this focus. The situation that exists there is a universal one for all of us. We see the pain and struggle of sickness, the hope of those loved ones that the ill one somehow will be healed, the ultimate sadness and grief of death, and then how the Lord engages those who mourn.

We are told that Mary “sat at home”, while Martha “went to meet Him.” And that is how we are sometimes isn’t it? Sometimes, we are like Mary, maybe we can just sit in silence, seeking consolation in prayer. Sometimes, we cry out to the Lord like she does when she says, “Lord, if you would have been here, my brother would not have died.” But see what happens? Jesus engages Martha and reveals Himself to her with the ultimate consolation and hope.

Then, the miraculous occurs as Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. The power of God brings all from darkness, despair and death, to new life and indescribable joy.

So, however our Lent has been thus far, let us not be discouraged and let us renew our efforts to pray, fast and give alms, to trust in the Lord’s presence among us always, even in times of sorrow and sadness. As I mentioned last week, I want to thank all who have supported our Diocesan Annual Campaign, formerly known as our Lenten Appeal. This is a most tangible way we can embrace that call to “give alms” and support those programs in our Diocese that serve the poor and needy. I am happy to report that we are about half way to our goal, but we are about \$40,000 behind where we were last year at this same time. So, I humbly urge all to please prayerfully consider donating to this most important Appeal.

This coming Tuesday, March 24th, we will celebrate our Parish Penance Service. Again, we are called to look beyond what we have done to what Christ wants to do for us, offering us the fullness of His reconciling love in the forgiveness of our sins. May the power of His mercy then sustain us in these final days, as we look to begin this upcoming week that we call “Holy”, to then celebrate, with great joy, the glory of Easter.





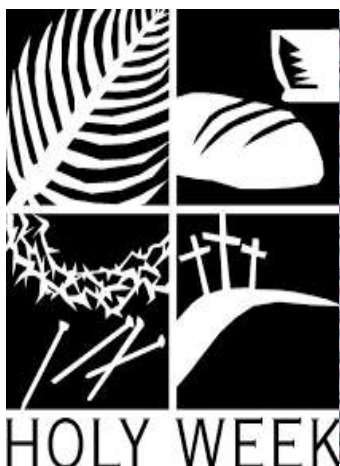
