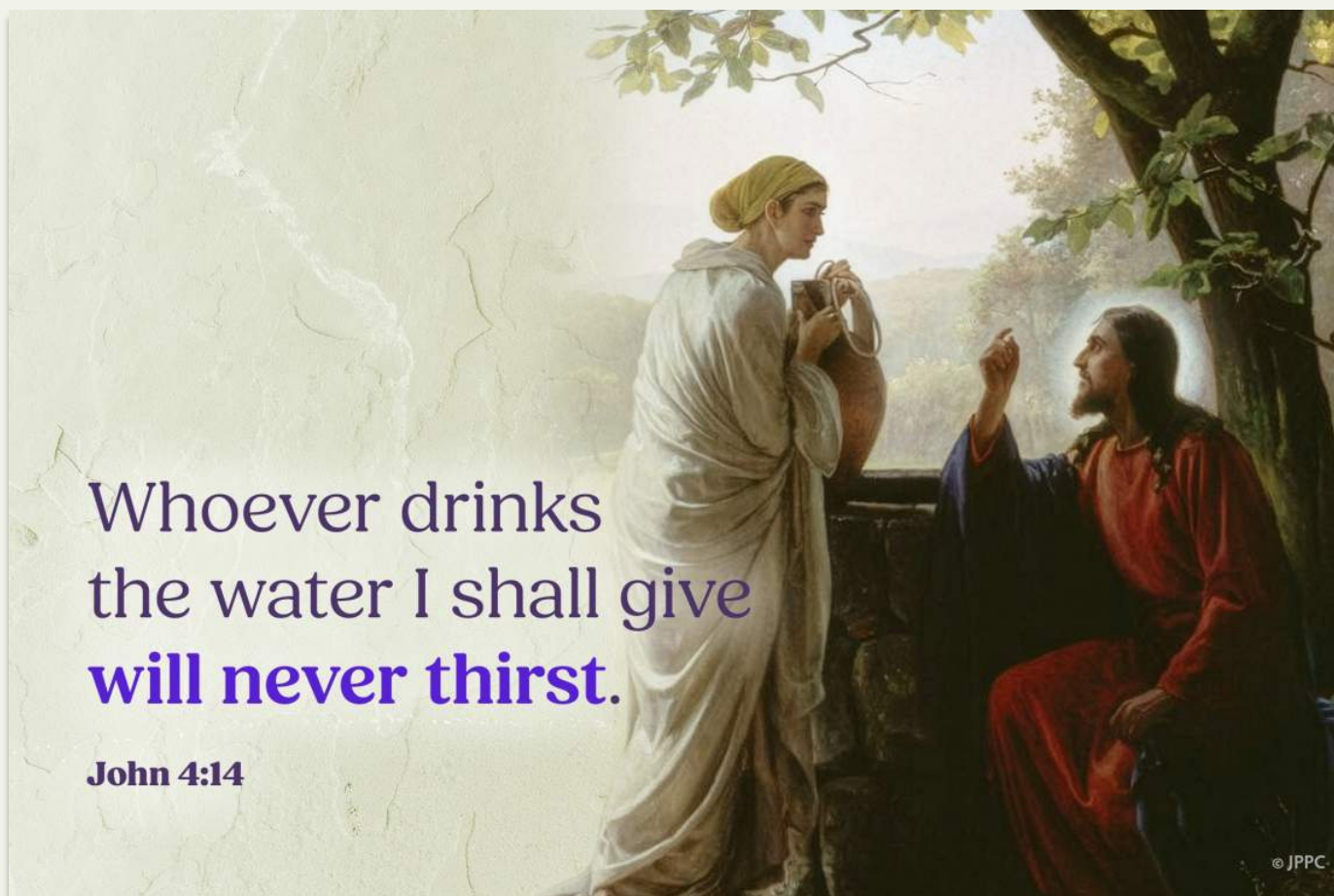

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active registered members of the parish and who are receiving the Sacraments on a regular basis.

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Today’s Gospel is one that is very well known to us. Since it is in Cycle A of our three year cycle of Readings, we hear it every third year, but even more, since it is to be used whenever we celebrate the “Scrutinies”, those special prayers for those adults who are to be baptized at our Easter Vigil, we hear it, sometimes, every year. It is an event that is so rich in its symbolism and meaning for us.

At its most basic level, it is simply an “encounter” between the Lord and another. But, of course, the symbolism goes so much deeper. First the person is a Samaritan, totally outside the context of God’s Chosen People. Secondly, she is a woman, with whom of course, at that time a Jewish man could never engage.

And so, Jesus approaches her and engages her with the simple request, “give me a drink.” The woman responds with incredulity at this request and then Jesus goes a bit further referencing the “gift of God” that is being presented to her. She again responds that He doesn’t even have a bucket but claims He can give her water. And so, the dialogue continues until she references the Messiah who is coming and then, in that dramatic conclusion if you will, Jesus says, “I am He”.

And this engagement and dialogue is exactly what is meant for us each and every day. As the woman is really just going about her daily routine, seeking to draw water that she needs to survive, she is led to the One who gives her so much more than what is needed for physical sustenance, that which is needed for eternal life.

He does this same thing whenever we come to Holy Mass. We are undoubtedly concerned about all that we need to do, but we open ourselves to this encounter. Here, He gives us the “water” of His grace, the power of His mercy and peace, and then, the ultimate “refreshment” of His Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist.

The past few days have been such blessed ones for our Parish. I am so grateful to Father Andrew St. Denis, one of the newly ordained Priests of our Diocese, now serving as the Parochial Vicar at St. Joseph’s Parish in York, who led us in our Forty Hours Devotion. He spoke of Our Lord as “the Way, the Truth and the Life”, those words from Saint John’s Gospel inscribed on the front of our Ambo, how our communion with Him in the Holy Eucharist leads us to that reality. And then, so many of us came to our Parish Dinner on Tuesday night for our Solemn Closing of these special days of prayer.

While I am grateful to him, I am so much more grateful for all of you, for so many who prayed and adored Our Lord with such reverence and devotion over these days. May God continue to bless us. May many of us avail ourselves of the grace of the Sacrament of Confession at our Parish Penance Service in just over two weeks on March 24th, as we continue in this glorious Season of Lent, looking ahead to the wondrous joy of Easter, to more fully each day be refreshed by that “living water” He gives, welling up, we pray, for all of us one day, to eternal life.

First Saturday Prayers to the Immaculate Heart of Mary
