## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

## SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

**“Do not be afraid! I know you are seeking Jesus the crucified.  
He is not here, for he has been raised just as He said.” (Matthew 28: 5-6)**

The Gospel of Saint Matthew, from which we hear this weekend, contains a most dramatic account of the glory of Our Lord’s Resurrection. Mary Magdalen and the other Mary come to the grave. There is a “great earthquake”. An angel descends from heaven, rolls back the stone and his appearance is “like lightening” and his clothing “white as snow”. Then the Angel says these words to the women, that they are not to be afraid, that Jesus, the crucified has been raised.

Of course, this is the most remarkable event imaginable. It is the ultimate expression of the power of God in His infinite love for us that His Son, who has undergone this most excruciating horror and death of crucifixion, is now raised in glory, to live forever and to bring all who believe in Him to that eternal life. It is the most important and most dramatic event in all of human history. We are told that the women “went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed.” This is a grand understatement, don’t you think? Certainly, they were “fearful”, in the incredulity that must have overwhelmed them. And certainly, they were “overjoyed”, and here we can’t even begin to feel the excitement and euphoria that consumed them.

Every time we gather for Holy Mass, you and I are brought more fully into this Event. His one perfect sacrifice on the Cross is “made present” for us so that its power may fill us and draw us more deeply into God’s love. We come here in all the difficulties and trials that are ours and we are meant to encounter the remarkable reality presented here, that this same Christ, risen in glory on that first Easter Sunday comes to you and me here and now in this Holy Eucharist. Having completed our 40 days of prayer and penance as we prepared for this during our Lenten Season, we are now meant to celebrate, for the next 50 days, the glory of our Easter Season.

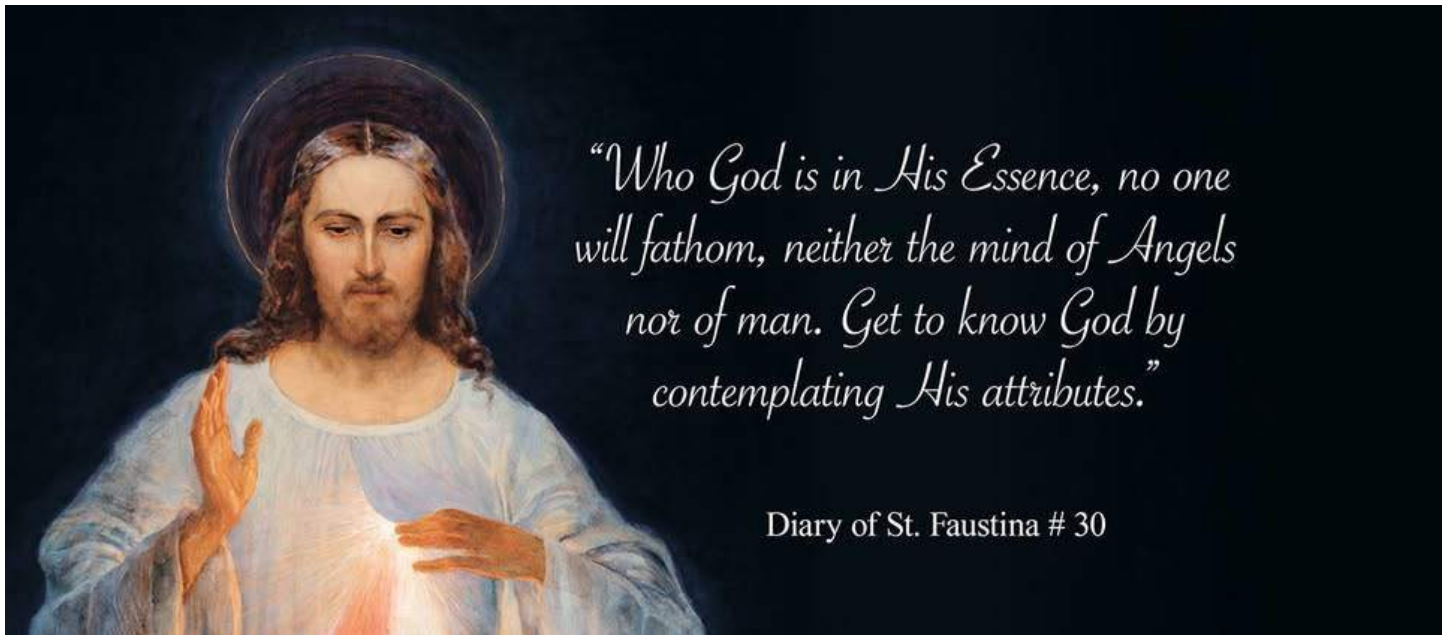
We are told that the women encountered Jesus, embraced His feet and did Him homage and He says to them what the Angel first said, “do not be afraid”. And so, we come here to do the same: to encounter Him, to be embraced by Him, and to receive Him so that amidst those trials and struggles that are ours, He might fill us with His presence and His peace.

On a personal note and on behalf of Father Kappes, I want to express my heartfelt thanks to so many of you who have done so much to make our Easter celebration so wonderful – Ginny Pryor and Elena Acker and the group of volunteers who have decorated our Sanctuary with such beauty; Kyle Postlethwait, and the Choir and other musicians and vocalists; Deacon Frank and our Readers, Servers and Extraordinary Ministers who have assisted in our Liturgies. But, most importantly, I want to thank each of you. Your faith and prayerful presence throughout Lent and now for these Easter celebrations continues to inspire.

Our Lord is risen! He is with us, now and always! May the fullness of His blessings be ours, now and throughout this holy Season and always, until that day, we pray, when we will experience in its fullness, His “new life” in His Eternal Kingdom of Heaven. Happy Easter!

### The Divine Mercy Image

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her:

**Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory (Diary, 47, 48). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You (327). I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world (47).**

At the request of her spiritual director, St. Faustina asked the Lord about the meaning of the rays in the image. She heard these words in reply:

**The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (299). By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works (742).**

These words indicate that the Image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Baptism and the Eucharist. Many different versions of this image have been painted, but our Lord made it clear that the painting itself is not what is important. When St. Faustina first saw the original image that was being painted under her direction, she wept in disappointment and complained to Jesus: "Who will paint You as beautiful as You are?" (313).

In answer, she heard these words: "**Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace.**" So, no matter which version of the image we prefer, we can be assured that it is a vehicle of God's grace if it is revered with trust in His mercy.
