## SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

### News Around Campus

#### SADD presentation with LCHS

Six Lancaster Catholic High School students involved in Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) visited St. Leo on April 8 to talk with middle schoolers about the perils of dangerous behavior like drinking alcohol, vaping and spending too much time on social media and their cell phones.

Yo Harmy Lopez, a junior, who is the vice president of SADD at LCHS, told students that substance abuse can have serious consequences though many adolescents think that nothing bad will happen to them if they engage in dangerous behavior. "Remember these actions not only affect you but also the people around you," Harmy said.

During the presentation, students participated in a mock simulation where high school students spun middle schoolers around to mimic the effects of impairment and then tried to catch pens. The exercise showed students that being impaired can slow reflexes and cause confusion.

The group also warned students about the perils of using social media too much. "Overusing social media can increase anxiety and depression and lower self-esteem and have physical side effects like stress and fatigue," Yo Harmy said. "It's something we all have to watch."

### Going the Extra Miles

Earlier this school year, Saint Leo's middle schoolers along with other middle schools in the Diocese of Harrisburg participated the first event, Food Fight!, hosted by the non-profit *Going the Extra Miles*, founded by York Catholic Sophomore, Miles Murdocca.

Miles is the Founder and Chief 'Fun' Officer of Going the Extra Miles, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to inspiring the next generation of volunteers. Through the lens of fun theory, his mission is to empower young leaders to drive community outreach in engaging and impactful ways. The organization focuses on fostering positive connections with students from elementary school onward, reinforcing the importance of civic responsibility and serving our communities.

The concept was simple, a food drive with a creative and fun twist. Students were challenged to collect food donations, but also stack, balance, or arrange them in a innovative and artistic way. Judging was based on the quantity of items collected as well as originality of the design. Six teams from York, Lancaster and Adams counties collected and donated over 2,500 food items! What a huge impact!

Saint Leo's students collect over 300 food items which were donated to the Hempfield Food Pantry. 6th Graders Chase Gauvain, Liam MacLaughlin, Paul Squierdo, and Thomas Richards gave up a Friday afternoon after school to build the Rocket, making sure it was stable but impressive.



Judges and Miles Murdocca himself visited on November 11th and were wowed by the Rocket display, earning Saint Leo's the honor of being the first school to take home the prestigious Food Fight! traveling trophy which was presented to the students on April 20th.



Miles invited all of the rising 6th through 8th graders to join us for next year's program in the 2026-2027 school year. This a traveling trophy...so it Saint Leo's wants to keep it, they need another great team to lead the way!

### A Catholic Perspective on End-of-Life Care

All are invited to attend an End-of-Life Seminar event on **Saturday, July 25, from 9 am-1 pm**, at the Diocesan Center (4800 Union Deposit Rd., Harrisburg). The seminar will be presented by Dr. Joseph Meaney, PhD, KM, and Mr. Paul T. Schemel, Esq., DSS Law.

Dr. Joseph Meaney is Past President and Senior Ethicist of the National Catholic Bioethics Center, who will share informative guidance to support our understanding and preparation for end-of-life issues. End-of-Life care and decision making are vitally important topics for almost everyone. Catholics frequently have a different ethical perspective from mainstream society and there are real dangers to accepting advanced directive advice from some medical/legal professionals. Preparation for Eternal Life has always been a paramount concern of the Church, and biomedical and legal changes make that more complicated than ever before.

Mr. Paul Schemel will offer a practical discussion of how Theology of the Body can inform our approach to medical powers-of-attorney, advance directives and POLST (Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment) documents, and how our will can be a means of both evangelizing our Catholic faith and maintaining peace among the family who survive us. Registration deadline: July 20. Cost is \$10 to attend.
