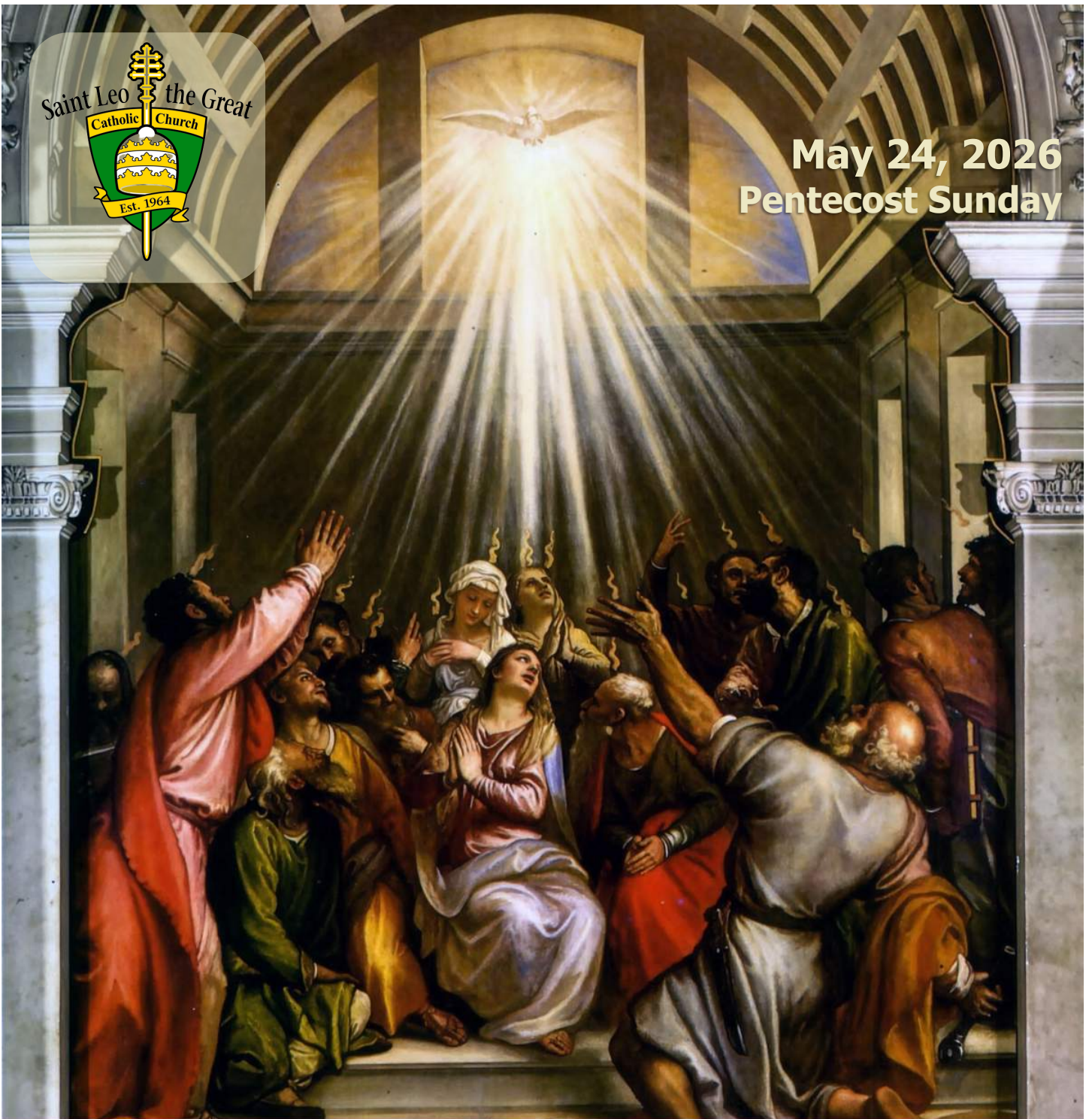

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

Adults interested in learning more about their faith or in becoming Catholic may join the program of formation and instruction which begins in September. Call the Religious Education Office.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

Letters of recommendation for sponsors of the Sacraments can be issued only to active registered members of the parish and who are receiving the Sacraments on a regular basis.

Help us to entrust ourselves fully to him and to believe in his love, especially at times of trial, beneath the shadow of the cross, when our faith is called to mature.

Sow in our faith the joy of the Risen One.

Remind us that those who believe are never alone. Teach us to see all things with the eyes of Jesus, that he may be light for our path. And may this light of faith always increase in us, until the dawn of that undying day which is Christ himself, your Son, our Lord!

“As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, so many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body . . . all given to drink of one Spirit.” - 1 Corinthians 12:12-13

These words have been proclaimed today, in our Second Reading, on this most glorious Solemnity of Pentecost. We gather today on what is often referred to as the “birthday of the Church, reflecting upon that event in our First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, recalling when the Holy Spirit was sent upon the Church; that “noise like a strong driving wind” that filled the Apostles and Mary and overwhelmed them with the very power of God.

We are called to see how this is not just an event from the distant past, but an ongoing reality. The Holy Spirit is continuously poured out on the Church to guide her always. And, for each of us, this Spirit was given to us in that Sacrament of Confirmation that while, in Baptism, the Holy Spirit came upon us to make us “a child of God”; in Confirmation, the Seven Gifts of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Knowledge, Piety, Fortitude and Fear of the Lord were bestowed upon us and we were given the power to be “a witness to Christ”, to boldly live and proclaim, the truth and love of God.

It is a most remarkable reality; that God truly dwells in us, that the Holy Spirit is given to us and remains with us so that we might too be overwhelmed with the life and love of God. It is this unity of faith, brought together in the love of God that is meant to animate us always.

I hope that often, all of us as we come into our Church, gaze and reflect upon those twelve “fruits of the Holy Spirit” that adorn the walls of the nave of our Church, - “charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity.”

We know that by virtue of our Baptism, all of us are united as a “holy priesthood, a people set apart” and it is the Holy Spirit that has formed us into that Mystical Body of Christ that is the Church. I love the reflection of Saint Cyril of Jerusalem which I think I have shared with you before as he sees the Holy Spirit in that image of “water”, how water comes down as rain, producing many different plants in the visible world although remaining always the same, so too “the Holy Spirit, whose nature is always the same, apportions grace to each man as He wills. Although the Spirit never changes, the effects of His action, by the will of God and in the name of Christ, are both many and marvelous.”

“Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. Kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created and You shall renew the face of the earth”. Happy Pentecost Sunday.

St. Augustine of Canterbury Memorial 5/27/26

When you hear "St. Augustine," you probably think of the 5th-century bishop from North Africa. And for good reason: St. Augustine of Hippo is one of the most important saints in history, a profound theologian whose writings continue to shape the Church today (just ask Pope Leo XIV, a member of the religious order inspired by him).

But that St. Augustine isn't the only one. There's also St. Augustine of Canterbury, who is worth celebrating in his own right. In 597 AD, he reintroduced Christianity to England after the fall of the Roman Empire. St. Augustine evangelized the Anglo-Saxons, purifying their practices and rituals when possible rather than abolishing them. Through his missionary work, England became a center of medieval Christianity.

A Catholic Perspective on End-of-Life Care - UPDATED INFO

All are invited to attend an End-of-Life Seminar event on **Saturday, July 25, from 9 am-1 pm**, at the Diocesan Center (4800 Union Deposit Rd., Harrisburg). The seminar will be presented by Dr. Joseph Meaney, PhD, KM, and Mr. Paul T. Schemel, Esq., DSS Law.

Dr. Joseph Meaney is Past President and Senior Ethicist of the National Catholic Bioethics Center, who will share informative guidance to support our understanding and preparation for end-of-life issues. End-of-Life care and decision making are vitally important topics for almost everyone. Catholics frequently have a different ethical perspective from mainstream society and there are real dangers to accepting advanced directive advice from some medical/legal professionals. Preparation for Eternal Life has always been a paramount concern of the Church, and biomedical and legal changes make that more complicated than ever before.

Mr. Paul Schemel will offer a practical discussion of how Theology of the Body can inform our approach to medical powers-of-attorney, advance directives and POLST (Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment) documents, and how our will can be a means of both evangelizing our Catholic faith and maintaining peace among the family who survive us.
