SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

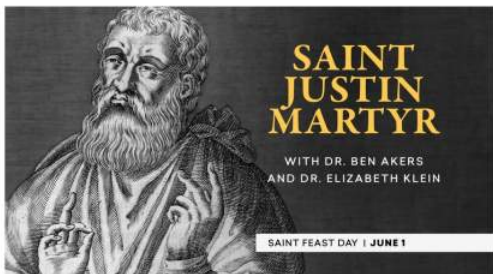

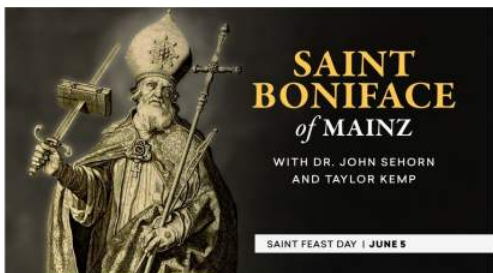
Lectio: God

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Diocese of Harrisburg recently partnered with the Steier Group to test the feasibility and potential support for a major initiative to fund several key priorities. The study was conducted from January through March 2026, and we received feedback from over 2,100 participants. The goal of the study was to gain insights from clergy, faithful donors, and parishioners across the diocese. Thank you for sharing your thoughts during this important process.

At the conclusion of the study, the Steier Group presented its findings and recommendations to me, my Senior Staff, the Presbyteral Council, the College of Deans, and the Diocesan Pastoral and Finance Councils. Two preliminary findings stood out:

- There was a broad and even response across all areas of the diocese – a sign that the survey results are representative of our registered Catholic population.
- 70% of respondents were in favor of a fundraising initiative and 76% indicated they would financially support the effort.

I encourage you to review the summary to learn more about the results on our website, www.hbgdiocese.org.

I have taken to heart all the constructive comments and suggestions voiced during this study, and with the support of my Senior Staff, Presbyteral Council, the College of Deans, as well as the Diocesan Pastoral and Finance Councils, we will begin preparations for a major fundraising initiative this month.

Many of the respondents provided very helpful feedback which will be seriously considered as we finalize the case statement and specific details for this initiative. Others raised thoughtful questions about the timing of a major fundraising initiative given current political and economic uncertainty. I respect those concerns. At the same time, when I look at our diocese and our nation, I see a Church that is alive and growing, with people seeking a deeper encounter with Jesus Christ. Considering the large number of people coming into the Catholic Church this past Easter, this is a moment filled with opportunity, and I believe we are called to respond with faith and confidence. Now is the time to move forward with hope and trust in God.

With that, there is much planning to do. In the coming months, we will develop more specific plans that detail how funds from this initiative will be used. Other questions must also be answered, including how this initiative will complement the Diocesan Annual Campaign, the overall structure of this effort, and how parishes and parishioners will be asked to participate. We will share this information with you as we make progress.

As we embark on this journey, please join me in praying to St. Patrick, the patron of our diocese, that through his intercession, we may rise to the challenges and opportunities of this effort, and that ultimately, we will strengthen the future of our diocese for decades to come.

Scores were calculated by assigning a value of 10 points for a high priority, 5 points for a moderate priority and 0 points for a low priority. The cumulative value for each project was then divided by the number of responses for that project.

OVERALL OBSERVATIONS

- » Bishop Senior, although new to the diocese, has made a positive early impact. He has established visibility across the diocese, is approachable and easy to connect with, and he has earned strong support among clergy. The bishop’s willingness to be personally present with clergy and parish communities strengthens unified messaging and early campaign momentum.
- » A first diocesan-wide campaign would provide a new platform to engage donors in a long-term vision and identify additional major-gift leadership. The diocese is positioned to launch a major fundraising initiative, supported by experienced professionals who can build enthusiasm through personal connection.
- » Diocesan communication is a consistent strength and appears to have improved over time, becoming more helpful and reliable. Regular updates through multiple channels (especially email, letters/mailings, parish bulletins, the website, and publications) make it easier for people to stay informed about diocesan events and activities, and to remain connected across the diocese.

STATISTICAL FINDINGS

-  of respondents personally favor a capital campaign, including **74%** of lay leaders interviewed.
-  of respondents indicated they would make a personal gift to the campaign, including **86%** of those interviewed.
-  **293** respondents indicated they would serve as a leader or volunteer.
-  **421** respondents reported that they have already included a gift to the diocese or their parish in their estate plans and **222** would like to receive more information about how to do so.

FUNDRAISING POTENTIAL

Based upon the positive results of the feasibility study, the Steier Group recommends that the Diocese of Harrisburg immediately moves forward into the preparation phase of a 30-month campaign beginning May 4, 2026.

The Steier Group projects that the Diocese of Harrisburg will raise **\$65 million to \$75 million** over the three-year campaign by using the firm’s recommended timeframe and approach.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS

- » The Steier Group recommends using the preparation phase and silent phase (which run concurrently) to finalize the campaign’s overall goal based on the projected funding potential and feedback shared by donors. The final goal should be aligned with Bishop Senior’s vision for the diocese’s revitalization and sustainable growth.
- » Refine the list of campaign priorities and add more detail about how funds will be allocated and the reasons for choosing to support these areas.
- » Securing and maintaining strong support from the clergy will be essential. They should be the first to hear the findings of the feasibility study. Establishing a Clergy Committee will be important to help shape campaign organization and structure.
- » The Diocese of Harrisburg’s leadership and the Steier Group should start identifying and recruiting a strong, diverse leadership team for the campaign. Secure commitments from key individuals identified through the feasibility study.
- » Every parish should take part in the capital campaign. All parish households should be asked to contribute. The Steier Group will create a campaign plan focused on personal, face-to-face visits with donors, including a specific request amount. That being said, we will work with each pastor to customize the campaign plan to fit every parish’s specific needs and culture.
- » A campaign is a tremendous opportunity to develop the understanding and practice of stewardship. Recognizing all gifts of time, talent, and treasure will be important.

A Catholic Perspective on End-of-Life Care - UPDATED INFO

All are invited to attend an End-of-Life Seminar event on **Saturday, July 25, from 9 am-1 pm**, at the Diocesan Center (4800 Union Deposit Rd., Harrisburg). The seminar will be presented by Dr. Joseph Meaney, PhD, KM, and Mr. Paul T. Schemel, Esq., DSS Law.

Dr. Joseph Meaney is Past President and Senior Ethicist of the National Catholic Bioethics Center, who will share informative guidance to support our understanding and preparation for end-of-life issues. End-of-Life care and decision making are vitally important topics for almost everyone. Catholics frequently have a different ethical perspective from mainstream society and there are real dangers to accepting advanced directive advice from some medical/legal professionals. Preparation for Eternal Life has always been a paramount concern of the Church, and biomedical and legal changes make that more complicated than ever before.

Mr. Paul Schemel will offer a practical discussion of how Theology of the Body can inform our approach to medical powers-of-attorney, advance directives and POLST (Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment) documents, and how our will can be a means of both evangelizing our Catholic faith and maintaining peace among the family who survive us. *Registration deadline: July 20. Cost is \$10 to attend.*
