SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parishioners who would like to have their child baptized at St. Leo's are requested to call Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office to personally schedule an appointment to meet with him to discuss this great Sacrament. Normally Baptisms are held on the first Sunday of each month, after our 11:00 am Mass, or approximately at 12:00 Noon. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic, age 16 or older, Confirmed, and must present a sponsor certificate if from another parish. Parents must be registered members of St. Leo's parish.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples contemplating marriage must contact Monsignor Hahn at the Parish Office at least one year before the date of the intended marriage. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING

Call any parish priest as soon as there is any serious illness.

HOLY COMMUNION TO THE SICK

When a parishioner is confined to home because of illness, advanced age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office and arrangements will be made to bring Holy Communion to the person.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

“Just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there till they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful . . . so shall my word be . . . achieving the end for which I sent it.” (Isaiah 55: 10-11)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

These words from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah are some of my favorites in all of Sacred Scripture. In a poetic proclamation, the Sacred Writer speaks of the inevitability of God’s Plan, how He is the One who is acting and guiding and directing all things throughout all of human history. Sections 302-324 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church summarize this teaching of our Faith as it begins with the simple phrase: “God carries out His Plan – Divine Providence”. I commend this to all for your reading and reflection as it gives us invaluable insight as to how we are to engage and embrace all things in our lives since all things are mysteriously part of His Plan, meant always to sanctify us, to grow in grace and in our life in Christ.

It is a necessary reminder for all of us as we face challenges, to know that God is always with us, that He is the one constant amidst all that changes in our lives. It is in this sense that I want to take this opportunity to review with all in our Parish a number of changes that have occurred over the past month or so. As with all changes, we trust in God and look to His guidance and grace as we move forward.

First, of course, we want to welcome Father Meinert back as our Parochial Vicar. Father served with us from June of 2022 until June 2024 and then, our Bishop thought a new assignment would be best for our Diocese. Last year, he returned to Lancaster as Chaplain of Lancaster Catholic and will continue in his service there. It is a joy to have him back in the Rectory. We continue to pray for Father Kappes in his new role as Pastor of Saint Pius X in Selinsgrove as we pray for Father Meinert and for all of our Priests, especially those who have begun new assignments in what for some, might be a dramatic change.

As all of you know, each Sunday for the past year and a half, we have begun our Masses, praying for Vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life. We have done so at the request of Bishop Senior, who in our Priests’ Convocation last year, asked that all Parishes earnestly pray for Vocations. He urged us to bring together a Vocation Ministry Team to work to promote Vocations in all our Parishes. I am so grateful to the families who have joined this effort and delighted to announce that one of our own, Christopher Johnson, has recently been accepted to begin Seminary studies in our Diocese. Christopher is the son of Brian and Tina Johnson and many of you know Tina, who works in our Parish Office. Let us pray for Christopher, as he begins his journey, a nine-year time of prayer and formation as he discerns this call. If it is God’s will, we pray that it will bring him to serve our Diocese as a Priest. We also pray that God will accomplish that “change” in his life and that others may join him in this openness to God’s call.

Thirdly, I want to announce a major change in our Parish School. Mrs. Jenn Miller, who served us for thirteen years, first as a Teacher and these last four as our Principal has resigned her position. Over the past few weeks, I have had a number of conversations with Jenn and know

that this was a difficult decision for her as she has devoted her life to Catholic Education. We wish Jenn the best and know again, that God will guide her and lead her to that next chapter in her life where she will flourish in her service to the Church. Please keep Jenn and her family in your prayers.

I am grateful that Mary Jo Diffendall, whom many of you know as a faithful and devoted parishioner here for 35 years, has agreed to serve as our “Interim Administrator” as we begin the process now of selecting a new Principal. Mary Jo has served our Parish and School for the past two years as our Development Director after many years of working at St. Anne’s Retirement Center and, before that, in the Advancement Office of Lancaster Catholic High School. I am absolutely confident that Mary Jo will effectively oversee our School operations during this time of transition. Michelle Navickas, our Vice Principal who also teaches 5th Grade, will continue to direct our Academic efforts.

Lastly, I hope that many of you have seen Bishop Senior’s recent Pastoral Letter. He published it on June 21, the Memorial of Saint Aloysius Gonzaga, which is the third anniversary of his installation as our Bishop and it has been presented “digitally” throughout the Diocese and will soon be available in print. Entitled “Stir into Flame: A Pastoral Vision for the Diocese of Harrisburg”, it reminds all of us of the call given to us to “build up the Body of Christ” among us. He identifies the areas of our Catholic Life, with his hope and prayers that all may be revitalized by the power of the Holy Spirit, noting specifically the areas of (1) Divine Worship; (2) Vocations; (3) Catholic Education; and (4) Evangelization; all of which, of course, are to be “lived in love”, fulfilling God’s call to love Him and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

As Bishop has also announced, this call will take on a “concrete expression” as our Diocese undertakes a Capital Campaign that is set to begin later this year. This will be a transformative effort that I hope all will join. As a result of our Parish Surveys undertaken a couple years ago and an extensive Diocesan wide Feasibility Study, several areas have been identified as having the broadest support, including (1) Vocations, (2) Catholic Education, (3) Catholic Charities, (4) Faith Formation and Evangelization, and others. I am honored to serve as the Chair of the Priests’ Committee, which has been meeting over the past weeks and will continue to do so over the next months. A formal “Case Study” will be presented later this year that will identify the initiatives that the Campaign will support.

There is certainly much that is “happening” and much that is “changing”. But again, amidst all of this, we must remember the “constant” of the presence of God and His perfect plan that directs and guides all things. May we trust in those words from Isaiah, that indeed, God’s word and His plan will achieve the end for which He has sent it. May Mary, the Mother of God and our Mother, intercede in all things for us to bring all of us closer to her Son, until that day, we pray, we will be with God and with her and all the Angels and Saints forever, in the eternal glory of heaven. God bless you.

6th World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly

'I will never forget you' (Is 49:15) is the theme chosen by the Holy Father for the Sixth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly which aims to emphasize how God's love for each person never fails, even in the fragility of old age.

Taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah, the chosen verse is intended to be a message of consolation and hope for all grandparents and the elderly, especially those who live in solitude or feel forgotten. At the same time, it is a call to families and ecclesial communities not to forget them, recognizing them as a precious presence and a blessing. The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, established by Pope Francis in 2021, is celebrated on the fourth Sunday of July and is an opportunity to bring the Church closer to the elderly and to value their contribution to families and communities. This year, the date coincides with the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, **Sunday, July 26th**.

The Catholic Grandparents Association has been at the forefront in campaigning for greater recognition of Grandparents for their role and vocation in passing on the faith to the next generation. The announcement of a Church-wide celebration for Grandparents and the Elderly came in answer to their prayerful request to the Holy Father, Pope Francis. This worldwide celebration in the Universal Church calendar is a momentous achievement for Grandparents and the Elderly, hopefully it reassures them that they are loved and that they are needed.

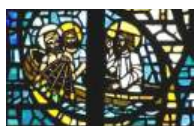
